INTRODUCTION:

AUG 2016 statistics show a 7.5% decrease in calls for service from last month (1592 to 1471). Arrest and Citation data between AUG 2015 and AUG 2016 showed a 16% decrease (231 to 192).

PERSONNEL ACTIONS:

No personnel actions were taken during this reporting period.

HIGH RISK LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES:

SBPD officers used 4 reportable level of force and conducted 0 vehicle pursuits during this reporting period (standard handcuffing, escort holds, etc. do not require additional reporting beyond our Uniform Crime Report – see following table for summary).

TRAINING:

As always, officers maintained their Class 1 Law Enforcement licenses via online training provided by the SC Criminal Justice Academy, and continued to receive their mandated in- service hours through the SC Criminal Justice Academy online.

OFC Canfora attended a 8-hour Tactical De-Escalation training August 24th in North Charleston as part of a plan to develop department-wide training on this topic.

CPT Miller attended a 40-hour training, SC Law Enforcement Commander's School, August 15-19th, 2016 at the National Advocacy Center in Columbia, SC.

In the month of August K9 Viking was deployed 2 times which resulted in 2 arrest for Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. K9 Viking performed approximately 4 hours of training to include tracking, narcotic detection, and obedience. PFC Martin and K9 Viking also attended the "Hands Across the Border" Safety/ LEN check point. (PFC Martin was out of work most of the month due to an off-duty injury, resulting in low deployments and training hours.)

K9 Biko and Handler Hans were deployed 5 times during the month that resulted in 6 arrests. These deployments resulted in the seizure of meth marijuana, loaded hypo needles with Heroin, pills, and various drug paraphernalia. The team also completed 16.17 hours of training in 7 training sessions which consisted in narcotics, building searches, vehicle searches, tracks, in service training and obedience.

Officer Hans and K9 Biko also attended the "Hands Across the Border" Safety/LEN check point.

WORKLOAD / PERFORMANCE METRICS:

As usual, we've included our Monthly Activity Report (along with the same period last month spreadsheet for comparison purposes). Also included is the Criminal Investigations log.

This month, SBPD officers issued 143 written warnings in lieu of Uniform Traffic Tickets or to record vehicles stopped for non-traffic related reasons (these are not reflected in our database totals).

NOTABLE EVENTS / INFORMATION

I have attached several citizen comments that were sent to the police department. During the month we have received many positive comments and visits from citizens showing their support for law enforcement. I sincerely wish to thank everyone that has visited and offered support for our officers.

August was a very successful month. We were able to solve several major cases that resulted in bringing closure to many victims, and re-unite them with their stolen property. Several press releases are attached that detail these arrest efforts.


