7 **1. CALL TO ORDER.** Mayor Samples called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Mayor Samples,
8 Mayor Pro Tempore Pellegrino, and Councilmembers Childs, Johnson, Mabry, Magliette and Stevens were in
9 attendance. A quorum was present. Others present: Town Administrator Fellner; Town Clerk Herrmann;
10 Finance Director King; Public Works Director Adair; Police Lieutenant Hofmann, and Recreation Supervisor
11 Ellis.

12
13 **2. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.**

14
15 A. Invocation: Fire & Police Chaplain Carmen Carella gave the invocation. Mr. Carella is also a lay
16 minister at Garden City Baptist Church.

17
18 B. Pledge of Allegiance: Mayor Samples lead the Pledge.

19
20 **3. AGENDA APPROVAL.** Mr. Johnson moved to approve the agenda. Ms. Mabry seconded. All
21 voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**

22
23 **4. MINUTES APPROVAL.** Ms. Mabry moved to approve the minutes of the June 5, 2014 budget
24 workshop as submitted. Mr. Johnson seconded. All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.** Ms. Mabry moved
25 to approve the minutes of the June 9, 2014 regular meeting as submitted. Mr. Johnson seconded. All voted in
26 favor. **MOTION CARRIED.** Ms. Mabry moved to approve the minutes of the June 14, 2014 special
27 meeting as submitted. Mr. Johnson seconded. All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**

28
29 **5. PUBLIC COMMENTS – Agenda Items (3 minutes.)** Ms. Holly Watson, North Oak Drive, believed
30 there were other ways to bring in revenue and lower expenditures so a tax increase would not be necessary.
31 She suggested that the road tax money be used for stormwater projects in the town's rights-of-way and under
32 the roads. Ms. Watson said the proposed budget did not reflect revenue from proposed sale of current assets,
33 and asked how that would be handled. She encouraged the town to find grant writers to generate revenue
34 streams for necessities. Ms. Watson expressed appreciation for Town Council's work, and said hopefully the
35 budget could be held closer to actual numbers instead of best guesses.

36
37 Mayor Samples called recess at 6:37 p.m. and reconvened the meeting at 6:43 p.m.

38
39 **6. COMMUNICATIONS.**

40
41 **A. Town Hall Reception Upgrade, Ms. Kerry Ann Dame, Posh Living, LLC.** Ms. Dame presented
42 a color board with a variety of fabrics, colors, and furniture types for Town Council's consideration. Mayor
43 Samples asked Ms. Dame to meet with the town administrator so appropriate recommendations could be
44 brought to council.

45
46 **B. Department Reports.**

47
48 **i. Finance.** Ms. King presented the written report, a copy of which is on file. General fund revenue
49 exceeds expenditures this year to day by \$125,000. Revenue exceed the prior year by \$650,000, which is due
50 to three major items: (1) moving parking revenue to general fund increasing the general fund by \$180,000; (2)
51 transfers from other funds were increased by \$120,000, and (3) Non-recurring revenue in the amount of
52 \$226,000, which included fixed asset sales that are not accounted for until sold. The amount includes
53 insurance claims in the amount of \$19,000 and under-ground utility reimbursement from Santee Cooper in the
54 amount of \$185,000. The utility reimbursement was planned for FY12-13 fiscal year, but payment was
55 received this fiscal year. Local business licenses and permit fees exceed last year by \$38,000. Renewals are
56 slightly ahead of last year. During May there were six new business licenses: 2 new rentals; 2 new
57 contractors, and 2 new businesses located outside the town. Salaries and benefits exceeding last year due to
58 the inclusion of salaries previously charged to hospitality funds, wages paid for storm cleanup, and the

59 increased cost of benefits. Capital projects fund expenditures for this year total \$122,000 for various
60 stormwater projects and lake maintenance. Expenditures are less than anticipated, because some projects
61 were pushed to the next fiscal year. Accommodations tax expenditures total \$455,000 for beach events,
62 beach patrol and advertising with the Chamber of Commerce. State accommodations revenue has decreased
63 by \$22,000. Hospitality collections exceed last year by \$29,000; the fund revenue has decreased overall due
64 to parking revenue being transferred to the general fund. Local accommodations taxes year-to-date total
65 \$112,000, which is \$1,000 above last year's total. Revenue for admissions and rent for the pier equal
66 \$192,000, exceeding last year by \$22,000. Parking has netted the pier \$53,000 this fiscal year. Sanitation
67 fund revenue exceeds last year by \$180,000; net revenue equals \$195,000 this fiscal year. Lanier Parking
68 Solutions parking and citation revenue collected equals \$263,000. Parking management expenses equal
69 \$117,000, netting \$146,000. Other parking expenses equal \$28,000, which nets \$118,000 total this fiscal year
70 for parking.

71
72 Mr. Magliette asked if the town had received any FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency)
73 reimbursement for the winter ice storm. Ms. King recently attended a seminar where she learned that the
74 State was just receiving reimbursement for the 2011 ice storm. She estimated that there is at least a two-year
75 lag for reimbursement. Mayor Samples said that was important for Town Council to consider. Mr. Magliette
76 asked if reimbursement was at 90-percent. Mr. Adair said there is a scale: the first 30 days gets
77 reimbursement at 85-percent; 30 to 60 days at 80-percent, beyond 60 days is 75-percent.

78
79 Mr. Stevens asked whether \$180,000 or \$263,000 equaled the total parking revenue. Ms. King said
80 \$180,000 was the increase in the general fund over last year. The total parking revenue was \$263,000. Mr.
81 Stevens believed that Ocean Boulevard meters only generated 8-percent of revenue, and asked if progress
82 was made on contacting vacant lot owners to create additional parking. Mayor Samples said that question
83 should be asked of the administrator.

84
85 Mayor Samples asked how the town accounted for revenue received when its assets were sold. Ms.
86 King said from an accounting standpoint, it depended on whether there was a trade-in or sale. If there is a
87 sale, the revenue was booked when it was received. If it was traded-in, there would be a net amount
88 budgeted for the purchase. Mayor Samples asked if the \$280,000 budgeted for a new truck was a trade-in
89 value. Mr. Adair said it is the price for a brand new truck. The old truck would probably be sold outright on
90 Gov-Deals.

91
92 **ii. Public Works.** Mr. Adair presented the written report, a copy of which is on file. Residential
93 service delivered eight carts per owners' requests. One cart was repaired and ten carts were replaced. The
94 sanitation supervisor responded to six calls regarding ordinance enforcement; 23 calls regarding late put outs
95 and/or questions about bulk/yard debris pick up, four calls involving billing questions, 26 calls concerning
96 winter and summer roll-out services, three miscellaneous calls, and eight complaints. Commercial service
97 routes continue to be updated based on business needs. Thirty accounts increased dumpster pick-up service.
98 Nine accounts required extra pick-up services due to overflow. The supervisor explained commercial
99 collection schedules to five new businesses: Sunrise Cleaning, Low Country Tops Wrecker Service, Old Blue
100 Chair, Hair Studio, LLC, and Seaside Stones, LLC. The new front-end loader trash truck was delivered and
101 will be put into service next week. May collections included 421.51 tons of solid waste, 41.99 tons of mixed
102 debris, 203.78 tons of yard debris, and 52.58 tons of recyclables. Swash outlets were being dug out as
103 needed to ensure proper water flow. The beach was being raked three times a week, weather permitting.
104 Beach trash and recycle cans are being checked and serviced at least three times a week and on weekends.
105 On-going and special projects include: Tim's Construction continues work on the 3rd Avenue South Channel
106 Bank Stabilization project; crews completed major drainage repairs and maintenance along 3rd Avenue South,
107 and two reports were sent to Santee Cooper identifying street lights that were not working. The streets
108 anticipated to be repaved this fiscal year were moved to next year, because the paving contractor had yet to
109 respond to Mr. Adair's calls. Those streets will receive priority. Crews replaced the Little Tykes slide at Fuller
110 Park. Repairs were made to the "Special Needs" swing harness at All Children's Park. From May 22nd
111 through June 18th mechanics completed 77 repairs on town vehicles and equipment. Preventive or scheduled
112 maintenance was performed on 54 vehicles and/or equipment. The facilities completed repairs and
113 renovations at the civic center, and also made some repairs at the rescue squad building. An additional 9-foot
114 bicycle rack was installed at the pier. Four umbrellas were installed by the benches, and some lighting repairs
115 were made.

116
117 Mayor Samples asked if the existing front loader truck was being traded or sold. Mr. Adair said it
118 would be sold. Mayor Samples said the sale would create unbudgeted revenue. He asked Mr. Adair to advise
119 Town Council of the amount received for the sale.
120

121 Mr. Stevens asked when the stormwater projects would begin on 3rd Avenue North and 16th Avenue
122 North. Mr. Adair said bids were received; he expected work would begin within a month. Mr. Stevens
123 encouraged everyone to go see the project at 3rd Avenue North and Ocean Boulevard that incorporated the
124 newest technology; it was an example of tax money well spent. He applauded Mr. Adair for his decision on
125 this project.
126

127 Mr. Magliette asked if the town could apply for a PARD (South Carolina Parks and Recreation
128 Department) grant to buy more bicycle racks to place at every beach access. Mr. Adair did not know, but if
129 multiple racks were ordered at one time, the purchase might qualify for a PARD grant. Over the last few years
130 the town has added six bicycle racks.
131

132 **iii. Special Events and Recreation.** Ms. Ellis presented the written report, a copy of which is on file.
133 The Farmers Market continues on Tuesdays and is averaging 18 to 20 vendors each week. Sunday
134 Serenades continue on Sundays at the Passive Park. Glenn Hanson reported that attendance has been as
135 high as 80 people. Movies After Dark began June 12. Attendance has been between 80 and 100 people.
136 Sophia's is handling the concessions and is doing extremely well. They have lowered prices from those
137 charged last year by the previous owners. The 4th of July Celebration entertainment will be "Garth Brooks &
138 Friends" from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Fireworks display begins at 9:30 p.m. Concessions of hot dogs,
139 hamburgers and drinks will be sold by SAFER, and 4th of July t-shirts will be available for \$5.00 each. Free
140 ice cream will be available to the first 500 children. Kids Fair is Monday, July 14th at Fuller Park. There will be
141 inflatables, pizza, drinks, and ice cream for the first 500 children ages 10 & under. Vendors including Palace
142 Theatre, Children's Museum, Horry County Solid Waste Authority, and Horry County Parks & Recreation will
143 be in attendance. New York Life Insurance will be making free child ID cards. Piggly Wiggly will provide free
144 watermelon slices. Entertainment will be provided by DJ Jeff Benton. Flyers were presented for the Meet N'
145 Greet Breakfasts that being in August.
146

147 **C. Administrator's Report – Update on Current Events.** Ms. Fellner said several calls were
148 received about excessive garbage at the pier last Saturday. A car was parked in the center parking aisle,
149 which prevented the garbage from being picked up by the front end loader that must traverse that aisle to
150 access the dumpster. The parking spots where the truck needs to cross are being posted for no parking
151 between midnight and 6:00 a.m. Offenders will be towed in the future to allow the truck to access the
152 dumpster. A link to the magazine is now on the town website homepage. Everyone was encouraged to email
153 the link to their friends and family as it was a wonderful marketing tool for the town. If the budget was adopted
154 tonight including the provision to fund Phases 1 to 3 of the north side stormwater project, Ms. Fellner wanted
155 to award the project to the low bidder, PSI of Conway whose bid was \$578,803.18. Bids ranged from that low
156 amount up to over \$1 million. Ms. Fellner sent a spreadsheet of the submitted bids to Town Council, and
157 would send confirmation of the award. Coffee with a Cop is July 1st from 7:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. at Benjamin's
158 Bakery & Café at 810 3rd Avenue South. K-9 Biko will be there to greet everyone. She hoped everyone would
159 attend.
160

161 Mr. Stevens asked Ms. Fellner if any progress was made on negotiating with owners of vacant on or
162 near the boulevard lots for parking. Ms. Fellner called everyone, but not everyone had responded. There is
163 definite interest, but Town Council has yet to provide direction as there were many variables to be determined
164 and cleared before parking could be implemented. Work should begin now for the next parking season.
165 Mayor Samples asked Ms. Fellner if she had options for council consideration. Ms. Fellner asked if council
166 was interested in moving forward, because the elder owners take inquiries very seriously. She did not want to
167 mislead anyone. Her instruction was to find out if there was interest, and it has been determined that there is
168 interest. Mayor Samples asked Ms. Fellner to provide location details and then council could decide how to
169 proceed. Mr. Childs said Mr. Servant at Surfside Realty Company may be able to help locate some of the
170 owners. Mayor Samples said at some point the town attorney would need to be involved to represent the
171 town. Once the properties are identified, a workshop or special meeting could be called. Mr. Stevens wanted
172 to direct Ms. Fellner to move forward to find out who was interested. Mayor Samples explained interest had

173 already been determined, but there were still many variables and legal issues to be resolved before Town
174 Council acted. Mr. Pellegrino reminded councilmembers that the parking committee recommendations were
175 not yet received, which might affect this process. He supported the plan. Ms. Mabry reiterated the need for
176 legal counsel, because mistakes seemed to be very costly.

177
178 **7. BUSINESS.**

179
180 **A. Second Reading of Ordinances**

181
182 **i. #14-0779 to adopt FY 2014-2015 Municipal Budget, Director King.** Mayor Samples said council
183 met several times to discuss the budget and asked for a motion. Ms. Mabry moved to adopt second reading of
184 Ordinance #14-0779 to adopt Fiscal Year 2014-2015 Municipal Budget. Mr. Childs seconded.

185
186 Mr. Pellegrino said the town had a good, constructive budget process with a series of meetings. He
187 believed that council took a spending turn at the end of the June 14th meeting, when a large amount of
188 expenditures were added to the budget, i.e. \$300,000 for stormwater projects. Obviously, there were issues
189 on the north end that were already being addressed and were funded with existing funds. He believed the
190 \$300,000 should be split over the next three fiscal years. Mr. Pellegrino said he could not support the
191 ordinance as proposed.

192
193 Mr. Stevens said the budget continually showed more expenses than revenue. In his opinion, that
194 was not fiscally conservative, and therefore, he could not support the budget.

195
196 Mayor Samples, and Councilmembers Childs, Johnson, and Mabry voted in favor. Mayor Pro
197 Tempore Pellegrino, and Councilmembers Magliette and Stevens voted against. **MOTION CARRIED.**

198
199 Mayor Samples said the town would award the contract for the three phases of the stormwater
200 projects. This budget fully funds those projects that had been deferred for at least two years. The budget sets
201 aside very close to \$500,000 for beach renourishment. A few years ago, there were zero dollars set aside for
202 beach renourishment. The budget uses monies in fund balances for the purposes for which the monies were
203 saved, for instance to pave roads. Since 2009, less than one mile of roads per year has been repaved. The
204 money has just been accumulating, but cannot be used for other purposes. The town must maintain its
205 assets, and this council intends to do so. It has been 12 years since a tax increase; hopefully, it will be 12
206 years or longer before another tax increase is needed. Mayor Samples appreciated all the effort that all
207 councilmembers put into this budget process. He believed this budget would enable the town to operate
208 efficiently and effectively. A few years ago there was a cash flow problem; that should *never* (speaker's
209 *emphasis*) occur.

210
211 **ii. #14-0777 to amend §2-208 Bidding & Quotation Requirements and Approval Authority,**
212 **Administrator Fellner.** Mr. Childs moved to adopt second reading of Ordinance #14-0777 to amend §2-208
213 Bidding & Quotation Requirements and Approval Authority with an amendment to change the \$1,000 limitation
214 to \$2,500 throughout the ordinance. Ms. Mabry seconded. Mr. Childs explained that council discussed this
215 during the budget process. A \$2,500 limit would expedite routine task and repairs and eliminate the quoting
216 process on items up to that amount. Ms. Mabry said Town Council asked that the ordinance be presented
217 with a \$2,500 limit, and she believed it was an oversight that it remained at \$1,000. Several councilmembers
218 agreed with Ms. Mabry. Ms. Fellner said that was a good idea; but, the change would allow department
219 directors to have spending discretion up to \$2,500. Mr. Childs said he trusted the directors to manage their
220 budgets appropriately. All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.** Mayor Samples suggested that the limitations
221 be evaluated in the future to ensure spending was on budget.

222
223 **B. First Reading Ordinance #14-0781 to amend §2-39(a) Agenda to establish authority to**
224 **create, and 2-54(a) and (b) Appearance of Citizens to clarify agenda topic comments and number of**
225 **speakers, Administrator Fellner.** Ms. Fellner presented the decision paper that is on file. Council concurred
226 at the June 9 meeting to bring these sections for consideration in ordinance form to establish authority to add
227 items to the agenda; to clarify that discussion is specifically for Town Council discussion; to clarify agenda
228 comments may be on *any* agenda item, and to remove the limitation on the number of speakers per topic.
229

230 Mr. Magliette moved to adopt first reading of Ordinance #14-0781. Mr. Childs seconded. Mr.
231 Magliette thanked Town Council for supporting the change to eliminate limiting the number of public speakers
232 allowed on a particular topic. He believed that every person's comments were important and should be heard.
233 All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**
234

235 **C. Annual Turkey Trot, Request for 3-year Commitment, Mr. Verlon Wulf.** Mayor Samples
236 introduced Mr. Wulf, president of the Surfside Area Rotary. Mr. Wulf introduced Mr. Scott Jordan, secretary
237 and president elect of the Rotary. Rotary has sponsored the annual Turkey Trot on Thanksgiving Day for
238 several years. The Rotary partnered with an administrative group to operate and promote the Turkey Trot. He
239 asked council for a three year commitment so proper planning could be done. Mr. Stevens moved to grant a
240 three year commitment to Surfside Rotary for the annual Turkey Trot. Mr. Johnson seconded. Mr. Pellegrino
241 said he and his children run the race every year. All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**
242

243 **D. Committee Appointments (may be deferred until after executive session.)**
244

245 **i. GSW&S Authority Advisory Board – Mr. Joe Martin.** Mr. Stevens moved to appoint Mr. Martin to
246 the Grand Strand Water and Sewer Authority Advisory Board. Mr. Johnson seconded. All voted in favor.
247 **MOTION CARRIED**
248

249 **ii. Parking Committee – The Hon. Bob Childs, Council Liaison.** Mr. Stevens moved to appoint Mr.
250 Childs council liaison to the parking committee. Ms. Mabry seconded. Mr. Childs said he could work well with
251 the parking committee to make it more effective and productive. He invited everyone to attend the meeting on
252 Tuesday, June 24th at six o'clock at the fire station. All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**
253

254 **8. DISCUSSION – Any matters of concern or information to be discussed by Town Council.**
255

256 Mayor Samples said the *Lambries* decision was overturned by the South Carolina Supreme Court,
257 which means any concerns about bringing an item for discussion only under this heading is appropriate. No
258 action is taken during discussion.
259

260 Ms. Mabry said the town would be sponsoring a food drive throughout August to benefit South Strand
261 Helping Hand. Collection bins will be at the Bi-Low and Piggly Wiggly grocery stores, town hall reception, and
262 the fire station. If you cannot deliver your donation, someone will pick it up. Mayor Samples said donations
263 could be delivered to Helping Hand at 812 South Poplar Drive.
264

265 Mr. Childs thanked Mr. Magliette for coordinating the Meet N' Greet breakfasts. He believed they
266 would be beneficial for everyone that attended.
267

268 **9. PUBLIC COMMENTS – General Comments (5 minutes.)**
269

270 Mr. Gary White of Lakeside Drive said that Floral Lake is filled with floating seaweed, and there are
271 branches from the ice storm protruding out of the water. Now would be a good time to remove those
272 branches, because the water is low. He asked if anything could be done about the seaweed.
273

274 Ms. Patricia Magliette of Harbor Lights Drive reminded everyone that tomorrow is Runoff Election Day.
275 Americans should exercise their right to vote, because it could affect what happens in Horry County.
276

277 Ms. Peggy Sattelmeyer of 13th Avenue North was happy to see council working together, but was
278 disappointed the welcome signs were not included in the budget. She suggested solar up-lighting be installed
279 at the north end welcome signs.
280

281 Mr. Ed Hunt of Cypress Drive said many people were not aware that Helping Hand accepts clothing
282 and household items in addition to food donations. Lately, yard debris in his neighborhood has not been
283 picked up regularly. Sometimes it was up to three weeks before it was removed. He said this was not a good
284 way to present the town.
285

286 Ms. Holly Watson of North Oak Drive, a former road contractor, said the road money might be used to
287 pay for stormwater projects on the town rights-of-way. She said dog waste bag stations should be placed
288 along Ocean Boulevard and town streets. Grocery bags could be recycled in the dispensers.
289

290 **10. COUNCIL COMMENTS.**

291
292 Ms. Mabry thanked everyone for attending. She agreed with Ms. Watson's comments about the dog
293 waste bag stations. Town Council discussed this proposal for over a year and thought there might be funds to
294 do something now.
295

296 Mr. Magliette thanked everyone for attending and sharing their comments. He thanked all the town
297 volunteers, particularly Dora Eaddy and Peggy Sattelmeyer who planted vinca flowers at the south end
298 welcome sign. Ms. Sattelmeyer also waters the hanging baskets at the pier. Without volunteers the town
299 would not have such beautiful landscape. Adopt-a-Beach will meet at 10th Avenue South Saturday at 7:00
300 a.m., if anyone wants to help. Surfside Library is hosting a program on estate and probate administration on
301 June 26th at 4:00 p.m. During June, the Food Lion Feeds Grand Strand Seniors provided groceries for 27
302 seniors at the South Strand Senior Center. The Senior Center is hosting a barbeque on July 3rd. He thanked
303 everyone for their donations, and offers of assistance. Contact him if there are questions about any of his
304 comments. He wished everyone a wonderful 4th of July. God bless you.
305

306 Mr. Childs commended Ms. Watson for her comments about the dog waste problem. Every council
307 has wrestled with that problem, and he welcomed a solution. Even if dogs are small, when there are several
308 hundred dogs, it does impact the town.
309

310 Mr. Johnson thanked everyone for attending and encouraged them to vote. God bless you.
311

312 Mr. Stevens thanked everyone for attending. He was glad Town Council supported Freedom of
313 Speech. Please vote. He commended public works for the 3rd Avenue South project, which would probably
314 last until great-great grandchildren visit town.
315

316 Mr. Pellegrino thanked everyone for attending. Three members were sworn in shortly before the
317 budget process began. It was a great learning experience for him. He was humbled to learn that it was much
318 more difficult to prepare a government budget than a corporate budget, because there are so many
319 restrictions. Past councils have done good things with the budget. The town has no debt other than some
320 leases, and past budgets included savings and reserves. Money was saved, for instance, to buy trash trucks.
321 Interaction between administration and councilmembers was good. Sessions were constructive. He did not
322 agree with everything, but councilmembers were passionate about their points. Expenditures were added that
323 he did not agree with, but he understood those who supported the projects really believed it was necessary.
324 He challenged everyone as future budgets were prepared to compare revenue to expenditures, and to look at
325 the unassigned account in the general fund, which is the town's emergency fund that should continually
326 increase. If the unassigned fund was increasing, then the council was doing a good job with the budget. He
327 challenged everyone to consider pure revenue versus pure expenses when preparing future budgets. He
328 reiterated appreciation for council and administration for helping him learn about government budgets. He
329 encouraged everyone to vote tomorrow. God bless everyone.
330

331 Mayor Samples thanked everyone for attending. He asked Mr. Adair to check Floral Lake to see if
332 there was anything that could be done. Based on comments heard by Town Council, he believed town
333 residents understood what they get for their tax dollars and they recognize that it had to be paid for. He
334 understood that business owners and investors were looking to avoid any additional expenses. The town is
335 safe; public safety is the number one priority. People live here, because they want a small, family oriented
336 town. Except when the town streets were originally paved, past councils have operated the town on a "pay as
337 you go" philosophy. Council needs to continue doing so, because if there is a major emergency the town may
338 need to borrow money. There is no way to budget for every contingency.

Total Fire Prevention Activities:

During the month the new businesses were inspected in accordance with State, NFPA and ICC codes. Monthly Safety Inspection of Town Hall, Police Station, and Conference Center and Rescue Squad were completed.

The final touches were put on the Citizens Fire Academy and the application will go on line August 1, 2014 for the first class.

The South Carolina State Fire Chiefs Association gave the “Richard S. Campbell Award” to the department for “**Excellence in Fire and Life Safety Education**”. We received a plaque and a check for \$250.00 to purchase fire and Life Safety education material.

We received a \$1,000.00 fire prevention grant from Walmart for our fire prevention activities and supplies.

Training

Volunteer and Career personnel dedicated 196 hours to training and 224 hours responding to calls during the month.

During the month of June, the training drill topics were extrication, fit testing, and 1410 drills.

Volunteer and career personnel reviewed the principles of extricating victims from automobile accidents and practiced the techniques required to perform those operations, like Incident Command, Stabilizing the Vehicle, and Package and Removal of Victims.

Fit testing - to ensure the proper use and correct size of the SCBA mask given to each Firefighter in fire suppression.

1410 drills - A 3 Man Company deploying a master stream device and making a hydrant connection before running out of tank water. Using 200ft of 2.5 inch hose and 100ft of 5 inch hose

Career personnel has completed the Municipal Association of South Carolina {Risk Management Services on line training} to receive an additional 4 hours of on-line training during the month.

All career personnel continue to do the Centrelearn training to keep up their skills and knowledge to stay up of the national trends as a First Responder. There are several different classes each month taken for additional 2-4 hours training.

Career personnel attended the required drills to meet their training hours to comply with ISO and NFPA requirements.

Staff Report

Captain Prentice Williams {Training Officer}:

Captain Williams continues to research training needs for our career and volunteer members.

He continues to work with the area departments on joint training and teaching our personnel on the skills needed to be efficient at emergencies. During the month of June he along with the other Captains continue conducting drills with the volunteers that consisted of driver operator drills on a one on one basis in addition to the standard Monday evening drills.

He continues to hold the CPR Classes, attended by both in town and out of town residents. Town Safety Training conducted each month to keep the town in compliance with our insurance carrier's requirements.

He is preparing the training for the month of May which will be centered on Motor Cycle Accidents and the ISO required night drill and the required multi-company drill..

Captain Williams is an outstanding employee.

Captain Robert Packard {Technical Services Officer}:

Captain Packard continues to work on updating inventories of fire hose, SCBA's, nozzles, fire gear and other small equipment in the department.

He is continuing to enter inventory Fire Programs and is continuing installing asset tags on all equipment that will have identifier numbers so that items identified by type, date in service and replacement dates match what is in Fire Program's inventory.

He has also been overseeing the station maintenance and cleaning supplies needed to complete that assignment. He has been working with DP3 and several of the suppliers regarding issues with the solar panel system due some design issues. He has been doing a great job staying on top of the problem.

Captain Packard is responsible for Technical Services {the facilities overall, equipment inspections, inventories, turn-out gear checks} and apparatus maintenance scheduling and repairs.

He is doing a good job and is a very good employee.

Captain Ted Sacra {Fire Prevention Officer}:

Captain Sacra is handling the fire prevention activities and inspections.

He has put a lot of time in on the inspections and pre-plans getting ready for the ISO re-evaluation. The records are now up-to-date and being entered in fire programs. He has been overseeing the map book up-dates so we can provide these to or auto-aid and mutual aid companies.

Captain Sacra is in the process of making sure that we have pre-plans on every commercial building in town and that they show the square footage, electrical panel, closest hydrants, hazards and many items needed by the incident commander in the event of a fire.

He is a model employee who strides to make improvements and is always willing to take on new assignments.

Engineer Tom Zimpleman {Engineer Firefighter II}:

Engineer Zimpleman continues to be an excellent employee; he has been assisting Captain Packard on different projects that include station inventories, equipment placement on the apparatus and facilities maintenance.

He has been attending EMT certification classes and will complete the program in August. The training course is a very demanding one that requires many hours of his personal time to complete. This is not a required course for his job description; he is improving his skills to serve the town better

He is a great asset to the department and is a hardworking employee.

Engineer Larry Carter {Engineer Firefighter II}:

Engineer Carter has been working on the map book up-dates and has been assisting Captain Williams with training and developing programs used in the training classes. Larry is always ready to assist with any projects that come up.

He has been given the task of surveying the hydrants in town and preparing a report of needs.

He is consistent and a hard worker, a good employee who is always on time and is always looking for something to do.

Engineer James Behrens {Engineer Firefighter II}:

Engineer Behrens is very eager to learn and has been doing a good job. He has been working with Captain Sacra on the pre-plans and inspections. He will be attending the next fire inspector class offered by the South Carolina Fire Academy. I am very pleased with his work ethic and his want to learn. He is a very good employee.

Chief's Comments:

The month of June was a very busy one with preparation for the ISO evaluation and a high call volume. We received twenty {20} applications to create a list for the Engineer/Firefighter II position. The list will be good for two {2} years and will be used to fill any vacancy's that may occur in that period. A written test and agility test administered to determine the order the applicants' eligibility for possible employment.

The advertisement for my position posted and we are receiving quite a few applications. The posting will end on July 18, 2014 and we will begin the task of reviewing and evaluating the applications.

The selection process will begin with the selection of 10 applicants that best meet the requirements of the position, that list narrowed to five or six people through visits to the town and interviews with the fire chief. Then a select group of South Carolina Fire Professionals, who will select three for interviews with the Town Manager, the successful candidates name presented to Mayor and Council for approval.

The ISO Re-evaluation conducted on June 10, 2014 with results in approximately 3 to 4 months. I believe that the evaluation went well and it is my hope we gained enough points to increase our rating to a Class 2. There are many items that determine the classification therefore it is very difficult to determine where we stand. We do have a few issues with fire hydrant locations that need to be addressed; we are working on a report for Mayor and Council that should be ready about September 1st or sooner.

I would like to thank the Officers of the Surfside Beach Police Department for all the support during the month assisting the FD on calls.

During the month, I attended the Southeastern Association of Fire Chiefs Conference, the South Carolina Fire Chiefs Conference, the Horry Georgetown Fire Chiefs meeting and performed 8 hours of in-service training.

Planning, Building & Zoning Department Report June 2014

Staff issued 87 building permits in June and conducted 177 inspections. Five (5) plans were reviewed including stormwater for additions and renovations.

We received 48 properties from the Keep Surfside Beach Beautiful Committee; we are looking through the list to determine the properties that have complied.

We have four (4) citizen complaints last month, most of which are weeds and overgrown lots. We found several contractors working on the weekend this past month without permits and have since picked up their license and permits.

The trip to Maryland's Emergency Management Institute was extremely helpful in getting a more detailed look at the requirements of the new CRS (Community Rating System) and the new requirements. The instructor made time to answer questions and give examples during class as well as after class was over. We had hands on training which was helpful in fully understanding the process.

One of the ordinances that need to be amended to add recommendations of higher standards is the town's flood damage prevention ordinance. I have a short presentation for you tonight. The Flood Focus Group reviewed the options given by the new CRS manual and have made the following recommendations. The ordinance will need to be reviewed by FEMA prior to presenting the changes for council adoption. A copy has been sent to Columbia for review. Once we get the ordinance back a formal request will be made by staff to adopt the changes.

Prohibition of Fill

Prohibition of fill - There are problems with using fill: it reduces floodplain storage capacity and it has an adverse impact on native vegetation, wetlands, drainage, and water quality.

Prohibit Critical Facilities in SFHA

Critical Facility: A structure or other improvement that, because of its function, size, service area, or uniqueness, has the potential to cause Serious bodily harm, extensive property damage, or disruption of vital socioeconomic activities if it is destroyed or damaged or if its functionality is impaired. Critical facilities include health and safety facilities, utilities, government facilities, and hazardous materials facilities.

The impact adjustment is based on the 500-year floodplain rather than SFHA.

Enclosure Limits (less than 299 sq. ft.)

Regulations to limit enclosures below the base flood elevation have two objectives. First, they protect the structural integrity of the building from wave action or hydrostatic pressure. Second, they discourage property owners from finishing the area below the base flood elevation and storing valuable or hazardous items in that area.

Local Drainage Protection

The International Building Code have a positive-drainage requirement that would receive some credit.

Regulations require that, as a condition of receiving a building permit, the applicant must prepare a site plan that (a) accounts for street flooding and local drainage from and onto adjoining properties, and (b) protects the building from local drainage flows.

Coastal A Zone higher standards

The term “Coastal A Zone” refers to that portion of the coastal SFHA located landward of the V Zone.

Foundation standards are required by the Community:

- New construction and substantial improvements are elevated on piles and columns
- The pile or column foundation and structure attached are anchored to resist floatation, collapse, and lateral movement due to the effects of wind and water loads
- New Construction and substantial improvements have the space below the lowest floor free of obstruction or enclosed greater than 299 sq. ft.
- Use of fill for structural support is prohibited.
- Bottom of the lowest horizontal structure member and the electrical and mechanical equipment servicing the building must be elevated to or above the base flood elevation.
- All new construction/additions are required to be located landward of the reach of mean high tide.

Coastal A & V Zone higher standards - Continued

- The community prohibits human alteration of any sand dunes or mangroves that would increase flood damage. These points are available only if the designated areas include sand dunes
- Regulations prohibit breakaway walls and enclosures of areas greater than 299 square feet that are below the base flood elevation. The area enclosed must still meet all NFIP requirements for openings, anchoring, and flood-resistant materials.

Non-Conversion Agreement

Regulations require that the owner of a building sign a non-conversion agreement that is filed with the deed and other property records and the community will inspect the enclosed area at least once a year.

Other Higher Standards

- ✓ Prohibit flood proofing as a flood protection measure for any new building (i.e. requiring all new buildings, including non-residential buildings to be elevated);
- ✓ Prohibiting installation of new septic systems in floodplain;
- ✓ Requiring an evacuation plan for new residential subdivisions that exceed 50 units.

State Mandated Regulations

Only coastal communities receive credit for a state requirement for a coastal setback line.

**The credit for training is based on the number of courses taken.

➤ **Detailed inspections:** Credit is for conducting three detailed inspections for each new building in the regulatory floodplain.

➤ Off-site record storage - In the past, hurricanes, fires, floods, and other disasters have destroyed local permit offices and their files. This credit encourages communities to safeguard their floodplain management permit records. Credit is given if copies of such documents (in digital, scanned, or paper format) are stored at a site out of the floodplain and at least one mile away. The records must be transferred or copied to the off-site storage location at least once each year.

INTRODUCTION:

June 2014 statistics show basically no change in calls for service from last month (1611 to 1614). Arrest and Citation data between June 2013 and June 2014 showed a 154% increase (153 to 390).

As always, these numbers will be detailed for you in the Workload / Performance Metrics section of the report.

PERSONNEL ACTIONS:

One personnel action was taken during this reporting period for a policy violation.

HIGH RISK LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES:

SBPD officers used one reportable level of force and conducted no vehicle pursuits during this reporting period (standard handcuffing, escort holds, etc. do not require additional reporting beyond our Uniform Crime Report – see following table for summary).

TRAINING:

As always, officers maintained their Class 1 Law Enforcement licenses via online training provided by the SC Criminal Justice Academy, and continued to receive their mandated in- service hours through the SC Criminal Justice Academy online.

CPL Curry attended a Basic Law Enforcement Instructor Development course held at the Criminal Justice Academy.

SGT Bailey attended a Defensive Tactics Instructor Course at the SCCJA. This certification will allow him to conduct in-house training on defensive tactics to SCCJA standards and standardize the way our officers respond to assaults and active resistance.

All personnel completed in-house training on new Violent Crime Recidivist Bond Procedures in compliance with a new state law.

All personnel completed MASC training on Preventing Workplace Violence.

Training continued with personnel working on obtaining FEMA/NIMS certification on IS-100, IS-200, and IS-700.

WORKLOAD / PERFORMANCE METRICS:

As usual, we've included our Monthly Activity Report (along with the same period last year spreadsheet for comparison purposes). Also included are the usual supplemental reports: the Criminal Investigations log and the USMS Fugitive Task Force report.

Sgt. Bailey's participation in the US Marshalls Task Force assisted our agency in clearing 4 of our outstanding warrants and collecting \$1123 in bond and fine money. The numbers for the month are low due to staffing and training needs.

This month, SBPD officers issued 162 written warnings in lieu of Uniform Traffic Tickets or to record vehicles stopped for non-traffic related reasons (these are not reflected in our database totals).

NOTABLE EVENTS / INFORMATION

On June 19, 2014 two Officers received recognition and awards for their performance at 2 different Grand Strand events.

Sergeant Lee Black received an award from The South Strand Optimist Club's Recognition of Law Enforcement Officers program. Sergeant Black received the award, in part, for his involvement in several community programs such as the Special Olympics and the Horry County Drive and Live Event. Sergeant Black also coaches youth baseball for the Surfside Beach Youth Sports Association in his free time. Sergeant Black has been with the Police Department since March, 2007 and is a Platoon Sergeant supervising uniformed officers.

Officer Ian Anderson received a lifesaving award from the South Carolina Police Chief's Association, presented by Myrtle Beach Police Chief Warren Gall. Officer Anderson was instrumental in saving the life of a shooting victim in Myrtle Beach during the recent Memorial Weekend bike rally. Officer Anderson has been with the Police Department since May, 2012 and is assigned to uniformed operations.

On July 1, 2014 SBPD and Sbfd hosted a Coffee with a Cop and Public Safety Forum event. The event was held at Benjamin's Bakery on 3rd Avenue South from 7:30 AM until 9:30 AM. K-9 Biko was on-hand for the citizens to meet, and the new Ocean Rescue equipment was on public display. The event was well attended, and we were able to interact with a number of town residents and business owners in a non-stressful and casual setting.

1. **SUBJECT: Second Reading of Ordinance #14-0781** to amend Town Code of Ordinances Sections 2-39(a) Agenda, 2-39(b)(9) Discussion, and 2-54(a) and (b) Appearance of Citizens.

2. **FOR: To clearly define and stipulate**

(a) 2-39(a) Pursuant to Section 59 of *Roberts Rules of Order* who has authority to add items to the agenda and to clarify the deadline for submission

(b) 2-39(b)(9) to add the words "Town Council" to the "Discussion" caption to clarify that the agenda item is for specifically for councilmembers to bring matters forward for discussion

(c) 2-54(a) to omit the word "business" in the section, because the public may speak about any agenda item

(d) 2-54(b) omit the word "business" when referring to the Public Comments-Agenda Items portion of the meeting

(e) 2-54(b) omit the phrase "with not more than three (3) speakers discussing the same subject"

(f) housekeeping – 2-54(b) omit 'Citizens' and guests'" because all comments are limited to 5 minutes regardless of whom is speaking

3. **PURPOSE:** To establish authority to add items to the agenda; to clarify that discussion is specifically for Town Council discussion; to clarify agenda comments may be on *any* agenda item, and to remove the limitation on the number of speakers per topic.

4. **ASSUMPTIONS:**

(a) There is no authority for anyone to add business to the agenda.

(b) Town Council's intention was to hear public comments about *any* agenda item, not just 'business' items.

5. **FACTS:**

(a) Town Council adopted first reading of this ordinance without changes at is June 23rd regular meeting

(b) Town Council concurred at the June 9, 2014 regular meeting to bring these items forward for consideration

(c) Adopting the amendments to §2-39 will clearly stipulate whom may add agenda items.

(d) *Robert's Rule of Order, 10th Edition*, Section 59, clearly states that authority must be given to those setting the agenda (see attached.)

(e) Adopting §2-39(b)(9) will clarify that the discussion topic is the appropriate time for councilmembers to bring forward matters of concern or interest for discussion

(f) Adopting 2-54(a) will allow public comments on any agenda topic, not just business

(g) Adopting 2-54(b) will allow anyone present at the meeting to speak on a topic regardless of how many others have spoken

6. **IMPACT OF SUCCESS OR FAILURE:**

(a) Failure to adopt the amendment will result in anyone being allowed to add agenda items at will; will prohibit public comments on any agenda topic other than "business" items, and will maintain the status quo of allowing only three speakers per topic

(b) Success will be achieved by town council agendas having relevant town business on its agendas, and the public will be enabled to speak about any agenda topic, and anyone present at the meeting may speak on a topic regardless of how many others have already spoken

7. **RECOMMENDATION:** Approve second reading of Ordinance #14-0781.

8. **RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION:** This ordinance was prepared based on Town Council concurrences at previous meetings and workshops, adopting the proposed ordinance will ensure that the town meeting agendas are properly set and the public may speak without restricting the number of speakers

1. **SUBJECT:** **First Reading of Ordinance #14-0782 to adopt rental fees for the Dick M. Johnson Civic Center and Floral Clubhouse**

2. **PURPOSE:** To establish rental fees for two town facilities that more than cover cleaning costs. Rental fees have never been established by ordinance for the use of the Dick M. Johnson Civic Center or Floral Clubhouse, and have never been sufficient to cover maintenance or cleaning fees.

3. **ASSUMPTIONS:**
 - (a) Groups and organizations will continue to use the facilities.
 - (b) By establishing fees, the fees can be used to absorb the cost of cleaning the facilities in a manner that people expect when being charged a fee.
 - (c) Fees will be collected for groups as prescribed by ordinance.
 - (d) Town Council desires to have the facilities used by the community at a reasonable cost

4. **FACTS:**
 - (a) Town Council heard a presentation about raising fees during the April 30 and May 1 budget workshop and subsequently concurred to have an ordinance brought for consideration
 - (b) Fees were not paid by a majority of users within the Civic Center
 - (c) Funds were being paid (donated) for the use of the center by some organizations, but not all.
 - (d) Establishing fees by ordinance will ensure that all renters pay a reasonable amount at a rate approved by Town Council

5. **IMPACT OF SUCCESS OR FAILURE:**
 - (a) Failure to implement the fees will result in a significant continued shortfall in revenue to maintain and operate the facilities
 - (b) Implementing the ordinance will codify the fee schedule and associated rules.
 - (c) Implementing the fees will bring in additional revenue to offset cleaning costs and some maintenance.

6. **RECOMMENDATION:** Approve as presented.

7. **RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION:** Approval of the ordinance as presented will codify fees for all users; ensure that the facilities are well maintained and sufficient revenue is generated for operation without additional expense to the town's taxpayers.

WHEREAS, the Town of Surfside Beach reviews its fees and charges and makes adjustments as necessary to assist the maintenance of its real property; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Town Council deem that the fee schedule should be reasonable and codified.

NOW, THEREFORE, Chapter 4, Article VIII of the Code of Ordinances of the Town of Surfside Beach, South Carolina, is hereby adopted and shall state:

CHAPTER 4. ARTICLE VIII. Rental Fees – Dick M. Johnson Civic Center and Floral Clubhouse

1. **On-going Fee Schedule.** Rates for the Dick M. Johnson Civic Center and the Floral Clubhouse for on-going meetings, events, or programs shall be:

<u>GROUP, ORGANIZATION OR BUSINESS</u>	<u>Rate</u>
Non-Profit Groups	\$25 per day
Weekly Groups and Organizations	\$50 per day
Business Organizations	Town Business License plus 10% of monthly revenue payable by the 5 th day of the following month

2. **One-time Rental Schedules.** Rates for the Dick M. Johnson Civic Center and the Floral Clubhouse for one time rentals for a meeting, an event, or a program shall be:

<u>ONE TIME RENTALS</u>	<u>Rate</u>
Dick M. Johnson Civic Center – Large Room	\$75
Dick M. Johnson Civic Center – Small Room	\$50
Floral Clubhouse	\$50

3. **Town Discretion to Rent.** The town in its sole discretion reserves the right to deny rental for any reason.

4. Town Reserves the Right to Pre-empt Rental. The Town of Surfside Beach reserves the right to pre-empt any regularly scheduled or one-time event for town business. In such instances, the rental fee shall be refunded, if already paid.

5. Rental Fees and Late Penalty.

A. Group, Organization or Business on-going rentals. Should any fee not be paid in accordance with the terms of this ordinance, a 20-percent late fee per month shall be applied. Failure to pay shall be deemed reasonable cause to refuse future rentals.

B. One time rentals. Payment for one time rentals are payable in advance.

6. Cleaning Deposit. A cleaning deposit of fifty (\$50) dollars per rental may be required to be paid in advance at the sole discretion of the recreation supervisor or her designee. The recreation supervisor or her designee shall have sole authority to determine whether facilities are cleaned in a manner that would warrant a refund.

SEVERABILITY. If any provision, clause, sentence, or paragraph of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be held invalid, that invalidity shall not affect the other provisions of this article, which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this article are declared to be severable.

- (b) KSBB assumed responsibility for designing and maintaining four hanging baskets at the Surfside pier until December 31, 2013
- (c) It was determined that hospitality funds could pay for the project at the pier
- (d) Town Council concurred to the project but no more than \$500 could be spent
- (e) In January 2014, KSBB reported that the hanging basket project was successful
- (f) KSBB proposed that hanging baskets continue to be placed at the pier; and also to add them along Surfside Drive, and hire a company to maintain them at a cost of about \$13,636 for supplies and flowers, including maintenance at about \$4,800 per year.
- (g) Town Council concurred to beautification of the Surfside Drive business district and the pier parking lot; if funds were available, beautification would be done on Ocean Boulevard between 3rd Avenues North and South

5. **IMPACT OF SUCCESS OR FAILURE:**

- (a) Failure to approve the beautification project will result in the existing baskets being maintained by public works, but no new baskets would be added.
- (b) Success will be achieved by maintaining the existing baskets, and beautifying other districts as mentioned in 4.(g)

6. **RECOMMENDATION;**

a. **Approve** \$15,000, which would be a budget amendment to the FY14-15 Municipal Budget, to maintain hanging baskets at the pier, and to add baskets in the Surfside Drive business district, and if there are sufficient funds, on Ocean Boulevard between 3rd Avenues North and South.

b. **RATIONALE FOR RECOMMENDATION:** The Town of Surfside Beach prides itself on being the Family Beach, such beautification projects enhance the family atmosphere in the town, and make it more welcoming to tourists, visitors and resident.




