6  
7 **1. CALL TO ORDER.** Mayor Samples called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Mayor Samples,  
8 Mayor Pro Tempore Pellegrino, and Councilmembers Childs, Johnson, Mabry, Magliette and Stevens  
9 were in attendance. A quorum was present. Others present: Town Administrator Fellner; Town Clerk  
10 Herrmann; Finance Director King; Public Works Director Adair and Recreation Supervisor Ellis.

11  
12 **2. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.**

13  
14 A. Invocation. Base Coordinator Jack Narvel of Youth on a Mission gave the invocation.

15  
16 B. Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Samples lead the Pledge.

17  
18 **3. AGENDA APPROVAL.** Ms. Mabry moved to approve the agenda with an amendment to  
19 include an executive session to discuss a personnel matter. Mr. Pellegrino seconded.

20  
21 Mr. Stevens objected to the amendment to enter executive session for a personnel matter. In his  
22 opinion, the personnel manual did not meet the criteria set forth in State Code Section 30-4-70. He said  
23 for the record, "This is inappropriate to go into executive session on a personnel manual. Also, the  
24 Municipal Association of South Carolina states every meeting of, every meeting of all public bodies must  
25 be open to the public unless one of the exceptions provided in 30-4-70 permits (\*\*) executive session.  
26 Exceptions include discussion of employment, appointment, compensation, promotion, demotion,  
27 discipline, or release of an employee, or the appointment to a public body; discussion of negotiations  
28 incident to proposed contractual arrangements, discussion of a proposed sale or purchase of property;  
29 receipt of legal advice, settlement of legal claim, discussion of public agency positions in a advisory [sic]  
30 situations, discussion about development of security personnel or devices, investigative proceedings  
31 regarding allegations of criminal misconduct, discussion of matters concerning the proposed location,  
32 expansion, or other provision of services encouraging location or expansion of industries or other  
33 businesses in this, in the area of the public. This item was discussed; some of the items that were  
34 discussed in this personnel manual were discussed in previous council, mainly 11/13/2012 and  
35 11/27/2012. This was all discussed in public, total transparency to everybody in town. There are some  
36 things in this personnel manual that I have read [sic] and looked at and I have a problem with it. So, I  
37 believe that it would be inappropriate for this body to go into executive session on something that does  
38 not meet the guidelines of section, Freedom of Information Act 30-4-70."  
39

40 Ms. Mabry said personnel compensation fell within the Freedom of Information guidelines.

41  
42 Mayor Samples said an attorney was not present, and suggested that the matter be deferred until  
43 a legal opinion could be obtained. Ms. Fellner said, "We've had this come up before, and because of the  
44 compensation issue, this involves financial and contractual things with specific employees in the town,  
45 and that is definitely not open. It should never be done in public. So, because we are a small town and  
46 I've talked to the MASC (Municipal Association of South Carolina) on this before. If you want me to go  
47 back and talk to them again, I would be happy to." Mayor Samples personally wanted Ms. Fellner to  
48 check again because he had a conversation with Mr. Stevens yesterday, but Mr. Stevens did not express  
49 any concerns. For the good of the town and the council, he asked for a motion to direct the administrator  
50 to determine whether personnel compensation satisfied the Freedom of Information criteria for executive  
51 session.  
52

53 Ms. Mabry and Mr. Pellegrino withdrew the primary motion and second, respectively. Ms. Mabry  
54 moved to direct the town administrator to get a legal opinion from the town attorney to determine whether  
55 the compensation discussion could be held in executive session and bring it back to Town Council. Ms.  
56 Stevens seconded. All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**

57 Mr. Johnson moved to approve the agenda as presented. Ms. Mabry seconded. All voted in  
58 favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**

59  
60 **4. MINUTES APPROVAL.** Mr. Pellegrino moved to approve the minutes of the August 12, 2014  
61 meeting as submitted. Mr. Magliette seconded. All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**

62  
63 **5. PUBLIC COMMENTS – Agenda Items (3 minutes.)** There were no public comments on  
64 agenda items.

65  
66 **6. COMMUNICATIONS.**

67  
68 **A. Proclamation #14-93 Constitution Week, September 17-23, 2014, Ms. Jean Courtney, 1<sup>st</sup>**  
69 **Vice Regent of Theodosia Burr Chapter DAR.** Mayor Samples presented the proclamation to Ms.  
70 Courtney and thanked the Chapter for its work recognizing and promoting the Constitution. Ms. Courtney  
71 distributed certificates of appreciation and information about the Constitution to Town Council.

72  
73 **B. Employee Service Award: Eric Simpson, 15-years.** Mayor Samples presented Mr.  
74 Simpson with a plaque, anniversary pin, and award check for his service. Mr. Simpson received a  
75 standing ovation.

76  
77 **C. Department Reports.**

78  
79 **i. Finance.** Ms. King presented the written report, a copy of which is attached hereto and made  
80 a part hereof by reference.

81  
82 Mr. Stevens asked if the percentage of parking revenue were determined for Ocean Boulevard.

83  
84 Mr. Johnson suggested that parking revenue totals for all areas be distributed to councilmembers.  
85 Ms. King said the information would be sent to councilmembers and/or presented at the next meeting.

86  
87 **ii. Public Works.** Mr. Adair presented the written report, a copy of is attached hereto and made  
88 a part hereof by reference.

89  
90 Mr. Stevens asked Mr. Adair to explain the beach drainage identification project. Mr. Adair said  
91 this was in conjunction with the Community Rating Service (CRS) program. The town will receive points  
92 for identifying the entire drainage infrastructure and performing annual inspections, which will ultimately  
93 create a master drainage plan that documents maintenance can be presented to FEMA (Federal  
94 Emergency Management Agency.) As many as 400 points can be awarded for the effort, which is close  
95 to a whole level jump. Mr. Stevens believed the next CRS meeting was on September 8<sup>th</sup> at one o'clock.  
96 He encouraged every to attend the meetings to learn how the town was working to reduce flood  
97 insurance premiums. Mr. Stevens asked how many reports were received of rats on the sand dunes. He  
98 personally saw an animal that appeared to be a rat, but could not take its picture. Mr. Adair said three  
99 calls were received, but there were no pictures.

100  
101 Mayor Samples asked what planning was being done for the infrastructure committee. Mr. Adair  
102 said during the next two fiscal years, the Grand Strand Transportation Authority (GSATS) has funds  
103 designated for Surfside Beach to make improvements to Highway 17. The first monies will be available in  
104 November 2014 when its fiscal year begins, and will be used to perform preliminary planning and  
105 engineering for part of a much larger total project that includes some additional traffic lights, meeting  
106 closures, curbs, and other improvements to make Highway 17 look as good as possible. Ten-foot maps  
107 are now being made of Highway 17 that will be presented to Town Council to develop a unified plan. If  
108 the town does not have a plan when the money is award, the town will be moved off the list. Mayor  
109 Samples said the town is one of several stakeholders; but is the primary sponsor under GSATS for funds  
110 that were approved in the state plan. It was critical that the town have a united position when funding  
111 starts or it would lose that money.

112  
113 Mr. Adair reported that the north side drainage project was started. The preconstruction meeting  
114 was held last week. September 15 through December 15 are the construction dates. The project  
115 includes Poplar Drive North from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> Avenues; 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue North from Poplar to Myrtle Drives; 16<sup>th</sup>  
116 Avenue North from Cedar to Magnolia Drives, and a couple of side streets. Flyers will be sent to the  
117 affected residents. The contractors have already started marking utilities and placing constructions flags.  
118 Driveways and sod will be restored to original conditions by the contractor; however, decorations in rights-  
119 of-way will not be replaced.

120  
121 Mr. Childs asked when the infrastructure committee could meet. Mr. Adair anticipated a meeting  
122 within two weeks. Mayor Samples said to make sure the meeting was advertised properly; he believed it  
123 would be beneficial for all members to be present.

124  
125 **iii. Special Events and Recreation.** Ms. Ellis presented the written report, a copy of is attached  
126 hereto and made a part hereof by reference.

127  
128 Mr. Childs said between 60 and 80 people were attending the Sunday Serenades. Mr. Hanson  
129 was asked to continue the serenades through September, but he was unable to do so.

130  
131 Mr. Stevens asked what it cost, how many vendors signed up and how many spaces were  
132 available at the Family Festival. Ms. Ellis said about 30 arts and crafts and information booths were  
133 reserved. There were 12 food vendors so far. There are 142 total spaces; most food vendors take two or  
134 three spaces. Arts and crafts booths cost \$50; food vendors pay \$60, plus an additional \$5 if electricity  
135 was provided.

136  
137 Mayor Samples asked Ms. Ellis to send the fall schedule and pertinent information along with  
138 contact information for the Youth Association board members to Town Council, and Will Rabon's  
139 information.

140  
141 **C. Administrator's Report – Update on Current Events.**

142  
143 **i. Update on Current Events.** Ms. Fellner reported that:

144  
145 a. Two of the property owners on Ocean Boulevard that own vacant lots contacted her. Both  
146 expressed interest in the calculation of liquidated damages, should they wish to terminate the  
147 agreement prior to the expiration of the 5-year term. In an effort to assist in the calculation of that  
148 number, she asked Mr. Adair to estimate the cost of readying those respective lots for parking and  
149 also for maintaining them on an annual basis. The zoning in that area calls for a 50/50 pervious/  
150 impervious ratio. She has those numbers and will begin calculating the cost of liquidated damages  
151 out. Ms. Mabry was asked to assist with this, because of her background, and John Draughn will also  
152 be asked to assist.

153  
154 b. At the last meeting Ms. Fellner reported that the town's conversion from Standard  
155 Industrial Classification (SIC) codes to North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes  
156 was progressing. The MASC reviewed the town's data and has begun the conversion process. They  
157 expect the timeframe for completion to be late September. MASC representatives will be asked to  
158 make a presentation October to discuss the conversion and which businesses are most impacted and  
159 how, etc.

160  
161 c. At the last meeting Mayor Samples asked if we budgeted the reimbursement revenue we  
162 received from FEMA (\$147,058.97.) Those funds were not budgeted in the last fiscal year, because  
163 there was no way to know there would be a storm. The money was not budgeted in this fiscal year as  
164 we did not know when we would receive the funds. Since the books are still open, however, it is being  
165 booked in the prior fiscal year, because that is when the event occurred.

166 d. Ms. Fellner reminded everyone that the workshop on the parking committee  
167 recommendations to council would be held Monday, September 8<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. in Council Chambers.  
168 The public is invited.

169 e. Ms. Fellner mentioned to both council and the public that the clerk will be out from  
170 September 2<sup>nd</sup> until September 23<sup>rd</sup>. If you need something that cannot wait until after her return,  
171 please contact either her or Ann Messall at the main town hall number.  
172

173 f. Although council was informed via email already, Ms. Fellner said for the public's benefit  
174 that the new Rescue Squad lease was finalized and executed. The term of tenancy ends October 30,  
175 2015; there is no provision for an extension or renewal.  
176

177 g. Of the 11 fire chief finalists, four have withdrawn for various reasons. The seven finalists  
178 will be interviewed tomorrow and vetted by our expert panel of fire personnel. The interviews with the  
179 finalists are scheduled for Thursday. Candidate or candidates for council's consideration will be  
180 presented at the next meeting during executive session. The panel consists of:  
181

- 182 • Chief Joe Palmer; Executive Director of the SC Firefighters Association which represents all
- 183 firefighters in SC and manages our 1% Fund.
- 184 • Chief Pat Wilson; President of the Southeastern Association of Fire Chiefs and Deputy Chief
- 185 of Operations for the Charleston Fire Department.
- 186 • Chief Greg Bulanow; Chief of the North Charleston Fire Department
- 187 • Chief Fred Crosby; Horry County Fire Rescue Chief. Just as a point of reference, Horry
- 188 County is the largest Combination Fire Department East of the Mississippi and is they are
- 189 also our Auto-Aid partner.
- 190 • Chief Alvin Payne; Myrtle Beach Fire Department Chief whose department supports us with
- 191 Mutual Aid.

192 ii. **Consensus Items.** Ms. Fellner had four consensus items:  
193

194 a. Santee Cooper is assigning a project number to the next phase of the town's underground  
195 conversion project and they will begin their portion of the design phase. At this point the town needs  
196 to contract with an engineering firm almost immediately to handle the joint utility conduit design. Ms.  
197 Fellner believed it would be in the best interest of the town to use DDC Engineers again as they are  
198 very familiar with these projects and have excellent project oversight. She did, however, want a  
199 consensus from council on this. The town paid DDC approximately \$130,000 and was reimbursed by  
200 Santee Cooper for 85-percent of cost. The actual cost for engineering to the town was slightly over  
201 \$19,500. After several comments, Town Council **CONCURRED to hire DDC Engineers to work**  
202 **with Santee Cooper on the next phase of underground wiring.**  
203  
204

205 b. Resolution #14-144 provides for the formation of a formal committee to help the CRS  
206 Coordinator with implementation of the Community Rating System Program pursuant to FEMA  
207 regulations. I would like a consensus of council to bring back to the next meeting a new resolution  
208 which formally creates that committee. I have spoken with the Coordinator and she is amenable to  
209 this being the "appropriate time", in accordance with the current resolution, to change from a focus  
210 group to a formal committee. Mayor Samples said membership would not change; the existing focus  
211 group would form the committee. Ms. Fellner said that was correct. Ms. Mabry said to clarify any  
212 misunderstanding that the Community Rating Service Committee was a FEMA directed committee.  
213 FEMA was very specific about who had to be on the committee. It was not a town *ad hoc* committee  
214 and did not want councilmembers to misunderstand. **COUNCIL CONCURRED to having the**  
215 **administrator bring a resolution to formalize the FEMA Community Rating Service Committee.**  
216  
217

218 c. Instead of presenting the flood ordinance at a regular meeting, Ms. Fellner recommended  
219 a workshop on Wednesday, September 24<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. to go over the proposed ordinance and take  
220 questions from council and the public. That date and time works for both all of the Focus Group

221 members and staff. Mayor Samples asked if the ordinance was approved by FEMA. Ms. Mabry said  
222 verbal approval was received, but written approval had not arrived. **COUNCIL CONCURRED to the**  
223 **workshop on September 24<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m.**  
224

225 d. Since the ordinance says parking extends until October 31<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 p.m. and that falls on  
226 a Friday this year, Ms. Fellner asked council's permission to begin the take down of outlying meters  
227 not generating revenue on Thursday, the 30<sup>th</sup> and continue through Friday the 31st. Pay stations  
228 would remain up, but they would be bagged or signage at 7:00 p.m. Friday and Lanier would  
229 dismantle and store them Monday. This would minimize added personnel costs because Lanier  
230 wouldn't need to pay staff for two additional days of takedown and storage work. The overall cost  
231 savings to the town would be \$491.19. **COUNCIL CONCURRED TO THE SCHEDULE.**  
232

233 Responses to public comments made at August 12 Town Council meeting:  
234

235 **Concern:** a resident asked what defines a resident group at the civic center.

236 **Response:** This was answered at the meeting, but in case anyone did not hear the response  
237 everyone in the group must be a town resident.  
238

239 **Concern:** a resident commented that a good job was done patching the water main but  
240 wondered when the permanent repair would be done.

241 **Response:** The paving company will be back in a few weeks to complete more paving. They  
242 preferred that it be left open to compact the base in the meanwhile. When they return the entire  
243 intersection will be replaced.  
244

245 **Concern:** a citizen asked that council please consider waiting to approve the ordinance on  
246 new flood damage requirements until FEMA finalizes its guidelines in 2015. He did not think it would  
247 be fair if contractors had to comply with changes that might not be required by FEMA.

248 **Response:** Councilmember Johnson answered this during the meeting. He stated that  
249 council will only act once FEMA finalizes their guidelines.  
250

251 **Concern:** a resident stated that there are rats in the dunes and wondered who they should  
252 call when they see one?

253 **Response:** Public Works has been keeping a log of sightings by week. Citizens can call  
254 843-913-6361 to report a rat. More than 4 sightings in a 7 day time span will necessitate bringing in  
255 an exterminator. Public Works Director and crews have also walked the dunes between Melody Lane  
256 and 15<sup>th</sup> South, and polled several renters if they have noticed any wildlife, but none were noted or  
257 found. Public Works will continue to be diligent in their inspections.  
258

259 **Concern:** as a result of the comments on the recycle containers, council recommended that  
260 we move more quickly on the transition from the small to large containers in the rental zone and  
261 asked for an update.

262 **Response:** Public Works has taken the lead on this problem, and for the last 3 fiscal years  
263 has been gradually replacing the original 33-gallon roll carts with 65-gallon carts in the rental areas. In  
264 the past 3 years staff changed-out approximately 100 cans per year and this year we budgeted  
265 \$10,000 and ordered 172 of the larger containers. This works to increase our recycling diversion rate,  
266 reduce the overflow problem, and reduce the need to add trash roll out carts for an extra charge to  
267 customers who have overflow. As the numbers of larger recycling carts have been distributed, based  
268 on need, these peripheral problems have gone down considerably. Ms. Fellner personally rode with  
269 the Public Works Director on Ocean Boulevard from one end of town to the other late in the afternoon  
270 on the day before recycling pickup and did not observe an overflow problem. Four cans on the entire  
271 stretch had lids not totally closed and two had cardboard stacked next to the can. Public Works will,  
272 however, continue to be diligent in policing this and distributing the larger cans when and where they  
273 are needed.  
274

275 Mr. Pellegrino asked if Chief Cimini would assist with interviews for the new fire chief. Ms. Feller  
276 said he did the initial paring down. He will sit in on all the interviews. Chief Cimini also helped formulate  
277 the questions along with the other chiefs that are involved. Mr. Pellegrino said insofar as the recycling  
278 overflow, he thought there were fewer tourists in town last weekend, but it was a huge problem the  
279 previous weeks. He saw over 50-percent of cans overflowing. He thanked staff for moving forward to  
280 purchase bigger bins.  
281

282 Mr. Stevens asked how many square feet are in the rescue squad building. Ms. Fellner would let  
283 council know that information. Mr. Stevens asked if the building would need to be refurbished, and if yes,  
284 were funds budgeted. Ms. Fellner said the building needed to be refurbished. Mayor Samples said Mr.  
285 Stevens may recall that \$200,000 was removed from the budget. Mr. Stevens said he did remember. He  
286 asked if Ms. Fellner had identified the vacant lots for parking. Ms. Fellner said negotiations were ongoing  
287 for those properties and she did not believe it would be proper. Mayor Samples said that was an  
288 executive session matter.  
289

290 Ms. Mabry said even four rodent sightings on the beach were too many. The heavy rains have  
291 displaced many types of wildlife. She asked staff, without any objection of Town Council, to be double-  
292 diligent in looking at that problem. Is she were here on vacation, that is the last thing she would want to  
293 see. **There were no objections by Town Council.** Ms. Fellner said public works staff was instructed to  
294 really look for nuisance wildlife.  
295

296 Mr. Johnson asked if the parking committee's recommendations would be delivered prior to the  
297 workshop. Ms. Fellner said the recommendations were delivered to her. She expected to distribute a  
298 PowerPoint presentation by this Friday.  
299

300 Mayor Samples asked how long it would take for the road repair at Lakeside and 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue  
301 South where the water main broke. Mr. Adair said one to two weeks; Grand Strand Water & Sewer is  
302 paying for the repair. Mayor Samples asked when the water tower would be completed. Ms. Fellner  
303 would check and let councilmembers know at the next meeting.  
304

## 305 **7. BUSINESS.**

306  
307 **A. Second Reading Ordinance #14-0783 to amend Section 8-38, Failure to Aid Police and**  
308 **to Correct Code Index, remove "public safety director" replace with "chief of police,"**  
309 **Administrator Fellner.** Ms. Fellner presented the consideration paper, a copy of which is on file. She  
310 explained that first reading was adopted at the August 12, 2014 meeting without change. This is a  
311 housekeeping correction to remove any reference to public safety department and public safety director.  
312 Mr. Stevens moved to approve second reading of Ordinance #14-0783 as presented. Mr. Johnson  
313 seconded. All voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**  
314

315 **B. First Reading Ordinance #14-0784 to establish Funds and Balance Guidelines, Director**  
316 **King.** Mayor Samples said the ordinance was presented for discuss at the last meeting, and has since  
317 been reviewed by the finance focus group and suggested changes resulting in the ordinance presented at  
318 this meeting. He asked Director King to present the decision paper, a copy of which is on file. She  
319 explained that codifying the policy clearly sets forth the purposes and intent of each fund, while stipulating  
320 minimum fund balances that will provide for ongoing town operations, emergency events, and long range  
321 projects. Mr. Stevens moved to approve first reading of Ordinance #14-0784 as presented. Mr. Childs  
322 seconded. Mr. Stevens said the ordinance was reviewed by the finance focus group. He suggested that  
323 Town Council adopt first reading and before the next meeting contact the administrator with any  
324 questions. He believed the ordinance was a step in the right direction. Mayor Samples agreed that there  
325 was no rush to adopt. There were two items in particular he wanted councilmembers to consider. First,  
326 the reserves set aside for road money, which is listed as a restricted fund in the audit. He could not find  
327 where the ordinance addressed road money. Ms. King said street funds were addressed in Section 2-  
328 187(d)ii. Second, historically the accommodations tax committee would hear staff recommendations for  
329 the next year's budget and then those recommendations would be presented to Town Council. In his

330 opinion, Town Council should be informed of staff's proposals prior to making recommendations to the  
331 accommodations tax committee. Ms. Mabry said the state law may address that. Mr. Magliette  
332 suggested a workshop on the proposed ordinance before second reading as he had many questions and  
333 would also like to hear public input. Mr. Pellegrino agreed; he supported the ordinance and a workshop.  
334 **There were no objections to holding a workshop prior to second reading.** Mayor Samples said a  
335 workshop to discuss this ordinance should be scheduled. Ms. Fellner suggested early October. All voted  
336 in favor to adopt first reading. **MOTION CARRIED.**

337  
338 **C. Resolution #14-147, Ad Hoc Committees to Communicate with Town Council and Town**  
339 **Administrator via Council Liaison, if one appointed, Administrator Fellner.** Mr. Stevens moved to  
340 adopt Resolution #14-174 as presented. Ms. Mabry seconded. Mr. Stevens moved to amend the  
341 resolution by adding "that the Town Council Liaison may defer to the committee chairman or spokesman  
342 for that committee, if desired." Mr. Childs seconded. All voted in favor of the motion to amend. **MOTION**  
343 **TO AMEND CARRIED.** All voted in favor of the primary motion as amended. **PRIMARY MOTION**  
344 **CARRIED AS AMENDED.**

345  
346 **8. DISCUSSION – Any matters of concern or information to be discussed by Town**  
347 **Council.**

348  
349 **A. Beach Renourishment Ordinance, Councilmember Mabry.** Ms. Mabry said adopting a  
350 beach renourishment ordinance would support the Community Rating System flood plain management.  
351 The ordinance would basically ensure that the town would continue to be a good steward and reserve at  
352 least \$50,000 or more every year per the ordinance just adopted that establishes funds. The FEMA  
353 Community Rating System will be bringing various ordinances to Town Council, many of which will be  
354 housekeeping issues. The ordinance will commit that the town recognizes the beach is the lifeblood of  
355 Surfside Beach and the town has an obligation to take care of it; the beach developed a huge tax base,  
356 and the town would do its due diligence. Mr. Stevens supported the ordinance and said that the three  
357 recently seated councilmembers all campaigned on the need for beach renourishment. **COUNCIL**  
358 **CONCURRED to direct the administrator to bring an ordinance for beach renourishment.**

359  
360 **B. Any matters of concern or information to be discussed by Town Council.** There were no  
361 other matters to be discussed.

362  
363 **9. PUBLIC COMMENTS – General Comments (5 minutes.)**

364  
365 Ms. Wanda Burgess, 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue South, asked Ms. Fellner when the state would eliminate the  
366 vibrator problem on Glens Bay Road. Ms. Fellner said she would find out. Ms. Burgess said there are  
367 multiple speed limits all over town. She liked consistency, and asked if there was a reason the town  
368 could not decide how slow it wants traffic to go.

369  
370 Mr. Tom Dodge, 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue North, said it was amazing that the President of the United States  
371 wanted to support the Constitution when there has never been a President that as opposed to the  
372 Constitution and who has done everything in his power to evade the Constitution than he [President  
373 Obama] has. He is a disgrace. He hoped that no Surfside Beach taxpayer money be spent on Highway  
374 17. Town residents taxes paid to the state include money to maintain Highway 17. He had seen rats at  
375 Melody Lane and the beach. The people of Ferguson, Missouri are exercising their First Amendment  
376 rights to protest and say things. He did not believe any of them were thrown out of town for voicing their  
377 opinions or facts, as is done here.

378  
379 Mr. Bill Dargan, North Pinewood, when the roads were being paved a few weeks ago a piece of  
380 equipment broke down and the contractor allowed about 30 gallons of hydraulic fluid to spill on the road.  
381 The clean up was simply to pile sand on top of it. He expected the contractor to shovel it and haul it off,  
382 because it was contaminated, but the sand was swept into the yards. He could not believe that was  
383 considered a clean-up. He did not believe the town had someone on site to inspect work. He called

384 OSHA (Occupational Safety & Health Administration), and then OSHA contacted the town. The town  
385 sent the street sweeper; the water from the street sweeper just pushed the fluid into the ground.  
386

387 Lieutenant Richard Loskill, Surfside Beach Fire Department, 2013 Firefighter of the Year, and  
388 president of the Surfside Area Fire and Emergency Responders (SAFER) reported on behalf of SAFER  
389 that the July 4<sup>th</sup> concession sales totaled about \$4,600. The supplies cost \$3,100, which netted \$1,500  
390 profit, of which \$100 was donated to the Shriners, who allowed SAFER to use their grill, and \$1,250 was  
391 donated to the American Red Cross. The net proceeds to SAFER were about \$50. Lt. Loskill offered to  
392 answer any questions about the program, which is a tax-exempt 501(C)(3) non-profit corporation  
393 registered with the Secretary of State. Surfside Beach Fire Department is not SAFER, but SAFER is  
394 Surfside Beach Fire Department.  
395

396 **10. COUNCIL COMMENTS.**  
397

398 Mr. Johnson thanked everyone for attending, be blessed and have a good evening.  
399

400 Mr. Pellegrino thanked everyone for attending, and he appreciated the public comments. They  
401 would follow up.  
402

403 Mr. Magliette thanked everyone for attending, and said August is the South Strand Helping Hand  
404 food drive. About 650 cans of food have been collected. Many wonderful people have donated at the  
405 various locations. Children are in school and need sneakers, jackets, and school supplies. Helping Hand  
406 also accepts clothing for adults. Flyers were distributed about the American Red Cross campaign. The  
407 South Strand Senior Center pamphlet was completed and available at the library, town hall, and other  
408 locations. Center membership is \$20 a year and includes free lunch and free transportation to the center.  
409 He said it was a blessing to live in this town, and it did his heart good to see the selflessness shown. It  
410 was by the grace of God and Devine Providence that he and Patti were here. They love the town. He  
411 thanked everyone for accepting them even though they were from New Jersey. They love everyone, and  
412 thanks them for all they do. God bless you.  
413

414 Ms. Mabry thanked everyone for attending. This was serious; neither the mayor nor one  
415 councilmember has any authority to circumvent any ordinance in town. Councilmembers cannot go to the  
416 zoning official and ask that they overlook something, because it is their friend. Councilmembers have no  
417 authority to do that. She asked everyone to please make sure that if you need anything that you call the  
418 proper directors. They are the ones in charge. Actually, it is against the law for any councilmember to  
419 ask for favors. So, she will not do it. Be careful, because sometimes councilmembers are asked if they  
420 can help someone. She, personally, would help by giving out the right telephone number or getting you in  
421 touch with the right official. It was very important for the public to know that Town Council had a "certain  
422 box" that it had to stay in. She intended to stay in that box. Thank you for attending tonight.  
423

424 Mr. Stevens thanked everyone for attending. It was good to see everyone, and he wished the  
425 entire room was filled with citizens so they could learn more about the town was doing to help them. He  
426 agreed that sometime too many speed limits were confusing. It was easy to go too fast, if you were not  
427 paying attention. He suggested police check the area at the south end of town where people customarily  
428 speed when entering town. He personally saw what he believed to be a rat; he did not get a picture, but  
429 would continue his research. A picture would provide concrete evidence. The contractor dumping oil on  
430 the road should never have happened. The town needs to be more diligent in patrolling contractors  
431 dumping trash in town. Taxpayers should not have to pay to have contractor's trash picked up. It was  
432 refreshing to see the Daughters of the American Revolution promote the Constitution. He believes in that  
433 document; freedom of speech is why the town has public comments on agenda items and general items.  
434 The government in Washington, DC does not believe in the Constitution, and he was really dissatisfied  
435 with it. Thank everyone for attending; have a good week.  
436

437 Mr. Childs thanked everyone for attending.  
438

439 Mayor Samples thanked everyone for attending. Since this council was seated, he believed the  
440 level of rancor was down; they are focused on important long-term issues, and the fact that council was  
441 considering codifying the fund policy to state how the taxpayers' money should be used showed the  
442 commitment to the town and its residents. Every administrator and probably every mayor had a different  
443 philosophy about budgeting. One reason the town had survived for 50 years was that there has been  
444 good leadership in the past. One reason residents live here is that there are no high-rise buildings.  
445 There is a good group of people that were working together to do what they believe is right, although they  
446 would not always agree. He was very proud that SAFER made a donation to the American Red Cross.  
447 You never know when you might need the American Red Cross. There but for the grace of God...  
448 Thank you all for attending.

449  
450 **11. ADJOURNMENT.**

451 Ms. Mabry moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:08 p.m. Mr. Childs seconded. All voted in favor.

# Proclamation #14-94

## FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OCTOBER 5-11, 2014

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Surfside Beach is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting our state; and

**WHEREAS**, fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

**WHEREAS**, home fires killed more than 2,300 people in the United States in 2012, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), and fire departments in the United States responded to 365,000 home fires; and

**WHEREAS**, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half; and

**WHEREAS**, three out of five home fire deaths result from fires in properties without working smoke alarms; and

**WHEREAS**, in one-fifth of all homes with smoke alarms, none were working; and

**WHEREAS**, when smoke alarms should have operated but did not do so it was usually because batteries were missing, disconnected, or dead; and

**WHEREAS**, Surfside Beach residents should install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home; and

**WHEREAS**, Surfside Beach residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more prepared and will, therefore, be more likely to survive a fire; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Surfside Beach first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through prevention and protection education; and

**WHEREAS**, Surfside Beach residents are responsive to public education measures and are able to take personal steps to increase their safety from fire, especially in their homes; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2014 Fire Prevention Week theme, “Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives: Test Yours Every Month!” effectively serves to remind us that we need working smoke alarms to give us the time to get out safely.

**THEREFORE**, I, Douglas F. Samples, Mayor of the Town of Surfside Beach, do hereby proclaim October 5-11, 2014, as Fire Prevention Week throughout the town, and I urge all the people of Surfside Beach to test their smoke alarms at least every month by pushing the test button, and to support the many public safety activities and efforts of Surfside Beach fire and emergency services during Fire Prevention Week 2014.

During the month, the new businesses inspected in accordance with State, NFPA and ICC codes. Monthly safety inspection of Town Hall, Police Station, Civic Center and Rescue Squad were completed.

The Fire Marshal continues working on planning for fire prevention open house and handouts needed for fire prevention month activities. Fire Prevention Week Open House will be Saturday October 11 from 11am until 3pm, full details posted shortly online and around town.

Beginning August 29, we started our part-time Fire Marshal / Inspector who will begin actual inspections beginning the week of September 15, 2014. He and Battalion Captain Sacra are developing a schedule and forms so that they will be ready to begin the inspections on the morning of the 15<sup>th</sup>.

## Training

Volunteer and Career personnel dedicated 330.5 hours to training and 258.25 hours responding to calls during the month of August.

During the month of August, the training drill topics were Firefighter Safety, Vehicle Stabilization and Denver Drill.

Surfside Beach Fire and Horry County Fire conducted several joint training sessions on Hydraulic Equipment and Vehicle stabilization. Junior Firefighters conducted training sessions on fire extinguisher and medic unit familiarization.

Water rescue training was on going during the month. We had a nationally registered Water Rescue Company come to town and certify 19 Fire personnel and 3 Police personnel in Ocean Rescue Techniques.

The Water Rescue Coalition has been conducting drills which have worked well and all agencies involved are pleased so far with how all events up and down the Grand Strand are going.

Career personnel completed the Municipal Association of South Carolina (Risk Management Services online training) for August to receive an additional 4 hours of online training during the month. All career personnel continue to do the CentreLearn training {Horry County Fire Rescue} to keep up their skills and knowledge to stay up of the national trends as a First Responder. The career personnel attended the required drills to meet their training hours to comply with ISO and NFPA requirements.

## **Staff Report**

### ***Captain Prentice Williams {Training Officer}:***

Captain Williams continues to research training needs for our career and volunteer members.

He continues to work with the area departments on joint training and teaching our personnel the skills needed to be efficient at emergencies. During the month of August he, along with the other Captains, continued conducting drills with the volunteers that consisted of driver operator drills on a one-on-one basis in addition to the standard Monday evening drills.

He continues to hold the CPR classes attended by both in town and out of town residents and this month taught the 100<sup>th</sup> person.

He continues to provide the Town Safety Training conducted each month to keep the town in compliance with our insurance carrier's requirements.

He has been working on the "Citizens Fire Academy" with Captain Sacra, scheduled to start on September 17. Applications are on the website.

He is preparing the training for the month of October centered on ISO required night drills and the required multi-company drill. Captain Williams is an outstanding employee.

### ***Captain Ted Sacra {Fire Prevention Officer}:***

Captain Sacra handles the fire prevention activities and inspections.

All inspection records are now up-to-date. He continues overseeing the map book updates so we can provide these to our auto-aid and mutual aid companies.

Captain Sacra continues to make sure that we have pre-plans on every commercial building in town and that they show the square footage, electrical panel locations, closest hydrants, hazards and many items needed by the incident commander in the event of a fire.

Captain Sacra has been working with Captain Williams on the development of the "Citizens Fire Academy". The advertisement is out with applications accepted until September 12.

He is a model employee who strives to make improvements and is always willing to take on new assignments.

***Captain Robert Packard {Technical Services Officer}:***

*Has been out on PTO Medical leave for the month, we are not sure when he will return.*

*Engineer Tom Zimpleman is acting Battalion Captain to fill Butch Packard's position and we are covering his shift with on call, part-time volunteers.*

***Engineer Tom Zimpleman {Engineer Firefighter II}:***

Engineer Zimpleman continues to be an excellent employee; he has been Acting Captain while Captain Packard is on medical leave. He is not only doing Captain Packard's work assignments but his own as well. I am very proud of his work ethic; he takes assignments and never complains.

He has been attending EMT certification classes completing the class during the month and is now a **SC / Nationally Registered EMT**. The training course was a very demanding one that required many hours of his personal time to complete. This is not a required course for his job description; he wanted to improve his skills to serve the town better.

Engineer Zimpleman oversees the Junior Firefighter program and works with them on weekly training programs. He is a great asset to the department and is a hardworking employee.

***Engineer Larry Carter {Engineer Firefighter II}:***

Engineer Carter has been working on the map book updates and has been assisting Captain Williams with training and developing programs used in the training classes. Larry is always ready to assist with any projects that come up.

He completed the hydrant survey and assisted with preparing the report of needs. He worked with the Water Company to get maps showing the areas that require additional hydrants and identifying water mains that need upgrading.

He is consistent and a hard worker, a good employee who is always on time and looking for something to do.

***Engineer James Behrens {Engineer Firefighter II}:***

Engineer Behrens is doing a good job. He has been working with Captain Sacra on the pre-plans and inspections. He continues his commitment to wanting to be a good firefighter and is becoming an excellent employee; he is always looking for things to do and opportunities to learn.

He is doing the updates on the pre-plans and has been doing an excellent job with the project.

He will be attending the next fire inspector class offered by the South Carolina Fire Academy.

I am very pleased with his work ethic and his desire to learn.

**Fire Chief's Comments:**

The month of August was very busy with the holiday weekend and a number of calls that kept our crews working hard. The heat and humidity made motor vehicle accidents difficult since our personnel have to wear firefighting turnout gear that is heavy and very hot.

We conducted interviews for my position on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of August by interviewing 7 candidates. The interview panel spent all day on the 27<sup>th</sup> interviewing the candidates and narrowed the list of candidates to 4. On the 28<sup>th</sup> Town Administrator Fellner, Executive Assistant Messall and I interviewed the four candidates.

Town Administrator Fellner will present a candidate for Councils consideration during the September 9 Executive Session.

I am working on a pass-on log for the new Chief that I hope he will find helpful in his first few months on the job.

I have submitted to Town Administrator Fellner a report on fire hydrant locations that need addressing in the coming years for your consideration during your budget visioning retreat in November.

I have attached a letter for Mayor and Council to consider for next year's Fourth of July event. After meeting with the Safety Committee and Chief Keziah, I felt it necessary to advise Mayor and Council of the issues from this past Fourth of July event.

During the month, I attended the International Association of Fire Chiefs Conference in Dallas Texas, the South Carolina Fire Chiefs meeting, the Horry/Georgetown Fire Chiefs meeting, the County E-911 dispatch update meeting, the Horry/Georgetown Water Rescue Coalition meeting, and the Horry County EMD meeting and performed 12 hours of in-service training.

# Planning, Building & Zoning Department Report

## August 2014

Permits issued in August exceed last year's totals. This August we issued a total of 124 compared to 107 last year. Inspections have also increased from 66 last year in August to 82 this year.

The FEMA CRS Committee which was established by consensus of council has been actively working on the three areas required by CRS. The three areas include Public Information, Flood Damage Reduction, and Hazard Mitigation. The committee has reviewed and made amendments to the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance as recommended by FEMA and the draft is currently being reviewed by FEMA. The committee is completing another project requirement for FEMA CRS. This project is the "2014 Floodplain and Stormwater Management Program for Public Information" it gives a brief background of the town's participation in CRS and the efforts made thus far regarding stormwater projects in the town. The document gives Flood Insurance Data which was compiled using FEMA information and recommends "target areas" within the town. These target areas will receive addition information as well as the information distributed to the entire town, regarding such topics as finding out if the property is located within a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA); who can purchase flood insurance; protecting our natural floodplain functions, etc. The program also addresses new proposed projects and projects that the town is currently doing, but may need to be more proactive with. It requires follow up from the committee yearly to review how the program is working and if changes need to be made, or additional target areas need to be added. Once the document has been completed in draft form, we will send the program to FEMA for review. Once we receive the approval of FEMA town council will be required to approve the document in ordinance form (required by FEMA).

The focus group consists of not only the town's CRS Floodplain Manger and the MS4 Coordinator; it also has seven (7) professional community stakeholders that recognize the importance of flood protection and hazard mitigation. The group, includes two (2) local insurance agents, one (1) local banker/lender, two (2) local realtors, one (1) floodplain resident and a Town Council member earn the town additional points towards a lower CRS rating based on their experience in their relevant fields. In addition, the town receives valuable insight from their collective expertise.

Also required by the CRS program, you have in your packets the 2014 Annual Report that has been submitted to FEMA as part of the 2014 recertification process.

We are currently in the process of interviewing for the Floodplain Technician and hoping to have someone on staff within the next few weeks.

In order to retain CRS credit for Activity 510 Floodplain Management, the town must prepare an annual report on the various activities the town is performing as referenced in the 2012 Hazard Mitigation Plan.

This annual report is prepared by Sabrina Morris, Planning, Building & Zoning Director/Certified Floodplain Manager. The annual report has been distributed to the local media is currently available to the public for viewing through the Town of Surfside Beach website. A paper copy can be obtained from the Planning, Building & Zoning Department at 115 US Hwy. 17 N. Surfside Beach, SC 29575 weekdays from 8:00am – 5:00pm.

### Action Items:

- **Maintain Elevation certificates on all new and substantially improved buildings in the Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA).**
  - This is an on-going activity that has been reviewed and approved by FEMA during our Community Assistance Visit (CAV) performed in 2013. We continue to require three elevation certifications for new and substantially improved buildings (construction drawings, building under construction and finished construction).
- **Maintain database for permits issued for new and substantially improved buildings in the SFHA.**
  - This is an on-going activity that has been reviewed and approved by FEMA during our Community Assistance Visit (CAV) performed in 2013. The Town of Surfside Beach continues to perform this activity in accordance with CRS requirements.

- **Provide Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) information.**
  - This is an on-going activity that has been reviewed and approved by FEMA during our Community Assistance Visit (CAV) performed in 2013. The town continues to assist property owners, developers, insurance agency and Realtors with flood map information. Because almost one-third of the Town is located within the 100-year floodplain, flood map determinations are made on every project, and determinations are requested by phone and in person from a variety of people on a regular basis. Map determination consist of identifying all relevant flood information about a parcel of land, including existing elevation, relationship to the 100-year flood elevation and required elevation for new construction or additions, which is one foot above the base flood elevation. Properties located in Velocity Zones (VE Zones) are also identified with additional requirements for break-away walls, etc.
  
- **Flood Protection Information Maintenance.**
  - This is an on-going activity that has been reviewed and approved by FEMA during our Community Assistance Visit (CAV) performed in 2013. The most current technical reference material is available to assist homeowners, developers, engineers, etc. in developing the design details to fully comply with the flood plain regulations. Technical information for flood hazard mitigation related to construction is necessary with every building permit application located within the Town of Surfside Beach limits. Information on the best ways to flood proof, how to handle mechanical equipment and ductwork, and many other topics is available. The Town maintains flood zone maps which are detailed enough to show property lines and outlines of existing structures. Flood maps are also available at the Town's Library for public review. Persons can call the Town's Building, Planning and Zoning Department for technical assistance at 843-913-6341.
  
- **Enforcement of the Floodplain Management Regulations and the International Building Code**
  - This is an on-going activity that has been reviewed and approved by FEMA during our Community Assistance Visit (CAV) performed in 2013. The town has adopted the 2012 IBC Codes and completed an update of the Flood Damage Prevention Code and received Town Council approval and adoption on November 26, 2013. The town currently has one Certified Building Official who inspects all buildings for compliance with the IBC Codes. The town has three Certified Floodplain Managers which review all plans within SFHA's to ensure compliance with the Adopted Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance.

- **Enforcement of Stormwater Management Regulations**
  - This is an on-going activity that has been reviewed and approved by FEMA during our Community Assistance Visit (CAV) performed in 2013. This activity is not only enforced by the Planning, Building & Zoning Department but also the Public Works Department. Two (2) staff members have become certified as Stormwater Management Inspectors and one (1) staff member is now certified in stormwater plan review. The town reviews stormwater plans for new construction and additions to ensure that the plans are in compliance with the Town's Stormwater ordinance for drainage, swale construction, and any and all other stormwater requirements. The town's Certified Floodplain Managers reviews new construction, additions, and improvement permits to also insure compliance of our Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance including freeboard of one foot above base flood. The town staff also does on site inspections to verify that the plans have been followed.
  
- **Enforcement of Building Elevation Regulations**
  - This is an on-going activity that has been reviewed and approved by FEMA during our Community Assistance Visit (CAV) performed in 2013. Staff continues to require all buildings to be elevated a foot above the base flood elevation by requiring the three elevation certificates at different aspects of the building process.
  
- **The Town of Surfside Beach Drainage Facilities Inspections and Maintenance**
  - This is an on-going activity where daily checks of all drains, catch basins, swales, ditches, ponds, and weirs during the course of their rounds. Drainage channels and surface water conveyances are monitored for all drainage problems and illicit discharge as required in Town ordinance. All actions taken are recorded by the Streets and Drainage Supervisor in the maintenance log, kept at the Public Works facility.
  
- **Property Protection and Flood Management Data to Repetitive Loss Properties.**
  - The town has worked diligently to eliminate all repetitive loss properties within the town.

**Implementation:** Funding is always an issue with projects on a government level. Council and staff will continue to plan for projects within the town to improve flooding and drainage problems. Town Council has approved the "Upper Myrtle and Magnolia Drainage Project for the 2014 fiscal year. This project has been awarded to a contractor, based on bids received. A pre-construction meeting has been held on the project. The project is expected to run from September 15, 2014 to December 15, 2014.

**Recommendations:** Emphasis should be placed on structures within the SFHA. Stringent requirements that assist in the protection of life and property should be a continuous focus for the town. Preventing drainage of stormwater run off from one property to another, establishing a higher freeboard to protect structures within the SFHA from storm surge and wave action, no fill and the prohibition of slab on grade structures are a few ways property protection is being recommended.

**Dissemination:** Documentation of the Progress Report will be submitted to the Town of Surfside Beach Town Council on September 9, 2014, and released to the media and public at the same time.

The town is scheduled for a CRS cycle visit in **2015**. The town has established a Flood Committee which has been instrumental in developing a draft Program for Public Information, proposed revisions to the Flood Damage Prevention ordinance and will be assisting in the development of the Town's Hazard Mitigation Plan. We are implementing additional requirements, activities and changes that will be presented to the ISO/CRS Specialist in hopes to reducing our community flood rating.

**TRAINING:**

As always, officers maintained their Class 1 Law Enforcement licenses via online training provided by the SC Criminal Justice Academy, and continued to receive their mandated in- service hours through the SC Criminal Justice Academy online.

Advanced training was at a minimum to maintain proper staffing levels during our peak season.

Officers Anderson, Carcich, and Manemeit completed a 16-hour course on Surf Rescue on August 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> held at the Surfside Beach Fire Department in conjunction with the Fire Dept. I would like to thank Chief Cimini for coordinating this much needed training.

LT Hofmann attended a 36-hour FBI-LEEDA Supervisor Leadership Institute held at the Myrtle Beach Police Department August 4<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>.

Chief Keziah, CAPT Miller, and LT Hofmann attended a one-day seminar on Law Enforcement Best Practices/Legal Trends sponsored by MASC/RMS in Summerville on August 26<sup>th</sup>.

All Personnel began MASC/RMS Training on Dealing with Intoxicated Individuals and Suicide Awareness for Law Enforcement.

## **WORKLOAD / PERFORMANCE METRICS:**

As usual, we've included our Monthly Activity Report (along with the same period last year spreadsheet for comparison purposes). Also included are the usual supplemental reports: the Criminal Investigations log and the USMS Fugitive Task Force report.

Sgt. Bailey's participation in the US Marshalls Task Force assisted our agency in clearing 14 of our outstanding warrants and collecting \$3890 in bond and fine money. The numbers for the month are low due to staffing and training needs.

This month, SBPD officers issued 99 written warnings in lieu of Uniform Traffic Tickets or to record vehicles stopped for non-traffic related reasons (these are not reflected in our database totals).

## **NOTABLE EVENTS / INFORMATION**

On Aug 9, a press release was issued to local media outlets outlining the arrest of a vehicle burglary suspect. Numerous cases have been cleared as a result of this arrest, along with stolen property being returned to the rightful owners.

On Aug 26, SBPD participated in the 15<sup>th</sup> Circuit Law Enforcement Network Hands Across the Border Initiative. During the awards ceremony we were presented a Utility Search and Rescue LED Light valued at over \$1200.00 for our participation.

Surfside Beach Police Officers have made an arrest in a string of vehicle burglaries that have occurred over the last week.

On 08 AUG, an officer on patrol observed some suspicious activity in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue South Beach Access. Upon further investigation the suspect was arrested, and numerous items of stolen property were recovered including a stolen handgun.

194 ii. **Consensus Items.** Ms. Fellner had four consensus items:

195  
196 a. Santee Cooper is assigning a project number to the next phase of the town's underground  
197 conversion project and they will begin their portion of the design phase. At this point the town needs  
198 to contract with an engineering firm almost immediately to handle the joint utility conduit design. Ms.  
199 Fellner believed it would be in the best interest of the town to use DDC Engineers again as they are  
200 very familiar with these projects and have excellent project oversight. She did, however, want a  
201 consensus from council on this. The town paid DDC approximately \$130,000 and was reimbursed by  
202 Santee Cooper for 85-percent of cost. The actual cost for engineering to the town was slightly over

206 b. Resolution #14-144 provides for the formation of a formal committee to help the CRS  
207 Coordinator with implementation of the Community Rating System Program pursuant to FEMA  
208 regulations. I would like a consensus of council to bring back to the next meeting a new resolution  
209 which formally creates that committee. I have spoken with the Coordinator and she is amenable to  
210 this being the "appropriate time", in accordance with the current resolution, to change from a focus  
211 group to a formal committee. Mayor Samples said membership would not change; the existing focus  
212 group would form the committee. Ms. Fellner said that was correct. Ms. Mabry said to clarify any  
213 misunderstanding that the Community Rating Service Committee was a FEMA directed committee.  
214 FEMA was very specific about who had to be on the committee. It was not a town *ad hoc* committee  
215 and did not want councilmembers to misunderstand. **COUNCIL CONCURRED to having the**  
216 **administrator bring a resolution to formalize the FEMA Community Rating Service Committee.**

217  
218 c. Instead of presenting the flood ordinance at a regular meeting, Ms. Fellner recommended  
219 a workshop on Wednesday, September 24<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 p.m. to go over the proposed ordinance and take  
220 questions from council and the public. That date and time works for both all of the Focus Group

***Affirmation of Participation in the Community Rating System Program***

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Surfside Beach Town Council in chambers duly assembled in a regularly scheduled meeting held on the 13th day of May 2014 is desirous of authorizing the Town of Surfside Beach Certified Community Rating System Coordinator to continue with aggressive participation in the Community Rating System (CRS) Program and

**WHEREAS**, Pursuant to Federal Emergency Management Act (FEMA), Town Council desires to authorize the planning director to take all necessary action to implement the CRS program, including the establishment of a formal committee at the appropriate time, pursuant to FEMA regulations.

**WHEREAS**, the Community Rating System recognizes, encourages, and rewards points for credit against the cost of flood insurance premiums by the application of flood insurance adjustments, community and state activities beyond the minimum required by NFIP; and

**WHEREAS**, the implementation of the Community Rating System has the potential to reduce insurance premiums, strengthen and support the insurance aspects of the NFIP, and encourage a comprehensive approach to flood plain management; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Surfside Beach recognizes the need to publicly lend its full support to any and all efforts in the participation and implementation of the Community Rating System of the National Flood Insurance Program that affects all of our residents; and

**WHEREAS**, The Town of Surfside Beach recognizes the recent changes in the NFIP and the potential for increased insurance premiums and remapping of flood designation areas in the near future.

## FIFTEENTH CIRCUIT DRUG ENFORCEMENT UNIT (DEU)

This agreement is entered into on this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_\_, and made pursuant to S.C. Code §§ 23-1-210 et. Seq. The Agencies and governing bodies entering into this Agreement are:

Myrtle Beach City Council.....Myrtle Beach Police Department  
Georgetown County Council.....Georgetown County Sheriff's Office  
Horry County Council.....Horry County Sheriff's Office  
Horry County Police Department  
Fifteenth Circuit Solicitor's Office

By their signatures affixed hereto, these Agencies and their respective governing bodies agree to the establishment of the Fifteenth Circuit Drug Enforcement Unit, hereinafter referred to as "DEU," and agree to be bound by the terms of this Agreement.

The parties to this Agreement understand and agree that the governing bodies of each participating Law Enforcement Agency must approve, and sign this Agreement before it is to be considered properly executed. By law, this is a duty that cannot be delegated to the Chiefs or heads of the respective Law Enforcement Agencies.

The parties to this Agreement understand and agree that the governing bodies of each respective Law Enforcement Agency (e.g. Myrtle Beach City Council as governing body of the Myrtle Beach Police Department) shall be notified by that Law Enforcement Agency of the

execution and termination of this Agreement and any amendment or subsequent Agreement. All parties acknowledge and agree that this notice must be in writing, and must be within seventy-two (72) hours of the Agreement's execution or termination. Further, the parties acknowledge and agree that this requirement is not ministerial, and must be strictly complied with. To accomplish this requirement, the DEU will supply a copy of this Agreement to the Law Enforcement Agency, who will in turn, provide such written notice to its governing body.

The DEU arose out of two circumstances: First, major drug enterprises are inherently multi-jurisdictional. Unilateral, uncoordinated investigations can be duplicative, and a waste of extremely limited resources. Second, in recent years, multi-agency drug enforcement units have been extremely effective in investigating and prosecuting large-scale drug organizations.

The parties to this Agreement all agree that there is an on-going problem with drug use and trafficking in the Fifteenth Circuit, and that past, present, and future drug related crimes are best investigated via a specialized team. As such, the DEU's mission is to identify, investigate, and prosecute individuals who participate in the manufacturing, cultivation, distribution, and/or trafficking of illegal drugs or controlled substances within the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit. Specifically, the DEU intends to combine the intelligence and investigative powers of the above-referenced law enforcement agencies in an effort to enhance and streamline drug investigations in Horry and Georgetown Counties.

In operation, the DEU shall maintain a close working relationship with all participating agencies, and shall provide information to assist in the arrest and conviction of individuals or organization members currently being investigated by the DEU. This ensures the efforts of the DEU and local narcotics teams do not overlap.

The parties to this Agreement acknowledge and agree that, from time to time, Law Enforcement Officers who have state-wide jurisdiction may be appointed to the DEU. This may include, for example, an agent from the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED), or from a college or university. This may be done solely with the advice and consent of the DEU Commander and the Chief or head of that officer's Agency. The parties to this Agreement need

not ratify or approve such an appointment, nor alter this Agreement in any way due to such an appointment, as such an officer will already be vested with state-wide jurisdiction, which necessarily includes the entire 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit. The appointment of such an officer shall not remove control of the DEU from the Commander and the Governing Board.

## ORGANIZATION

The DEU shall operate out of locations mutually agreed upon by the participating Agencies.

A Governing Board, consisting of the Fifteenth Circuit Solicitor, and the head of each participating Law Enforcement Agency will set policy, approve the budget, and provide general direction for DEU operations.

Each Law Enforcement Agency head shall, with the advice and consent of the DEU Commander, appoint agents from his or her agency to be assigned to the DEU. Each Agency head shall make best efforts to insure that the individuals appointed and assigned to the DEU are of the highest quality available. The assignment of each individual agent from his or her respective Agency shall be for a temporary time period, at the discretion of the DEU Commander or the officer's Agency head. The DEU Commander will review each Agent's caseload and performance on an annual basis while the Agent is assigned to the DEU. Unsatisfactory performance will submit the Agent to a review of the Governing Board, in order to determine whether he or she should be sent back to his or her home agency.

With the exception of the DEU Commander, Deputy Commander, or other individuals specifically identified by the Governing Board, each DEU Agent will be equal in rank while participating in the DEU, regardless of the rank that each holds in his or her respective Agency.

All Agents assigned to a unit will adhere to the DEU policies and procedures. Failure to do so is grounds for dismissal from the DEU. In the event that an Agent fails to fulfill his or her duties while assigned to the DEU, the DEU Commander may suspend the Agent, and remove him or her from participating in any DEU activities, until such time as the Governing Board

meets and decides whether the Agent should be permanently removed from the DEU. If the DEU Commander becomes aware that an Agent has violated the policies of his or her home Agency, he shall notify the appropriate official within that Agency or Department. The decision to remove any DEU Agent from service shall be made by a simple majority vote of the Governing Board.

## AGENTS

DEU Agents shall be vested with the authority and jurisdiction of agencies located within the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit-whether state, county, or municipal. This authority and jurisdiction is the same as any other commissioned agent. Each Agent will report to the DEU Commander and the Governing Board. Direct Agency supervision will be left to the DEU Commander or Deputy Commanders. In order to maintain operation security, participating Agencies will avoid unnecessary involvement in DEU investigations. All DEU investigations, targets, areas of interest, and activities will be reported solely through the DEU Commander and the Governing Board.

The participating Agencies shall assume all civil liability for the actions of their respective assigned law enforcement agents while they are acting within the course and scope of their duties. This shall be regardless of the incident location, and shall encompass, but not be limited to negligence, gross negligence, or recklessness.

This Agreement will in no manner effect the compensation, pension, or retirement rights of any Agent acting under its authority. Such Agents shall continue to be paid by their home Agency, or, where they are permanently employed. The bond for any Agent operating under this Agreement will include coverage for all of the Agent's activities in the counties or municipalities covered by the Agreement, and to the same extent as provided by bonds of regularly employed state, county, or municipal agents.

The parties to the Agreement expressly agree that reimbursement for services, as described in this Agreement, will be limited to the same kind and quantity as provided by the involved Agencies. Any other agreement for reimbursement must be made in writing between or among the Agencies on a case-by-case basis.

Agent work schedules shall vary according to the priorities, timing, and volume of cases being investigated during the workweek, and will be determined by the DEU Commander or Field Supervisor.

The normal workweek will be forty (40) hours. Each Agent may be requested by the DEU Commander to work no more than ten (10) hours of overtime, per pay period, without prior approval. After ten (10) hours, the DEU Commander must contact the head of the Agency that assigned the Agent, for approval.

## AGENT SUPPORT

Each participating Agency agrees to provide its DEU Agents with the following: 1) an unmarked police car, 2) a ballistic vest, 3) standard issued police equipment such as handcuffs, flashlight, etc. 4) a service weapon, 5) a 12 gauge shotgun, 6) a mobile communications device such as a mobile or cellular phone, 7) any other equipment the Governing Board deems necessary.

Each participating Agency is responsible for maintaining its Agents' Academy and DEU mandated training as required by law. Special instruction may be required for DEU Agents, and, if approved by the Agent's home Agency, he or she may attend that special training at that Agency's expense.

The DEU Commander will, within thirty (30) days of his or her appointment, create a Standard Operation Procedure Manual. This Manual must be unanimously approved by all participating Agencies. The Manual will direct all DEU operations, and will become part and parcel of this Agreement.

Once funding becomes available, the DEU will provide each Agent with a common shield, raid jacket, shirt, or other necessary attire, displaying “DEU” and “Police.”

## ASSET FORFEITURE

While the DEU’s primary mission is to identify, investigate, and prosecute major drug offenders and organizations, parallel emphasis will be placed on the identification, seizure, and ultimate forfeiture of the gains of illegal activity. When assets are successfully forfeited as a result of DEU investigation and prosecution, the following guidelines will apply:

1. Assets seized in Georgetown County, which are later awarded to law enforcement, also known as “Program Income,” will be held in an interest-bearing account for the duration of the grant period. During the grant period, the DEU shall provide to each participating Agency, an accounting of Program Income, no less than on a quarterly basis.
2. Assets seized in Georgetown County (Program Income) may be used to purchase equipment, or for any other use related to the DEU’s mission, so long as the Governing Board and grant coordinator approve the expenditures.
3. After the grant period expires, assets seized in Georgetown County (Program Income) that remain, shall be distributed to all participating agencies, subject to the approval of the South Carolina Department of Public Safety, and in accordance with the following formula:
  - a. The total of each agency’s months of service during the distribution period, divided by all Agents months of service during the distribution period. (example: for a distribution period of one year, and a total number of Agents months of 180, if Conway Police Department has one Agent assigned to the DEU for 12 months, and another assigned for 6 months, it would get a

distribution of 18 months divided by 180 months, or 10% of distributable Program Income)

4. Assets seized in Horry County that are awarded to law enforcement shall be distributed to all participating Agencies in accordance with the following formula:
  - a. The total of each agency's months of service during the distribution period, divided by all Agents months of service during the distribution period. (example: for a distribution period of one year, and a total number of Agents months of 180, if Conway Police Department has one Agent assigned to the DEU for 12 months, and another assigned for 6 months, it would get a distribution of 18 months divided by 180 months, or 10% of distributable Program Income)
5. Assets seized as a result of DEU efforts will be awarded in accordance with state law, and will be shared among all participating Agencies, as set forth above.
6. The DEU may use money or assets seized in furtherance of its stated mission, in accordance with the provisions of this Agreement.

## DISSOLUTION

Upon the DEU's dissolution, all equipment purchased using grant funds will be retained by the Agency that paid the local match. All equipment purchased using DEU income will be divided as set forth above at the time of dissolution.

If a participating Agency chooses to withdraw from the DEU while the DEU is operational, that Agency may retain all the equipment that it purchased. Equipment purchased with grant funds or the matching funds paid by the withdrawing Agency will be assigned to DEU so long as the DEU continues to operate. No equipment purchased using Program Income will be assigned to any withdrawing Agency, so long as the DEU continues to operate.

This Agreement shall supersede, govern, and have control over any prior DEU Agreement or Agreements executed by the parties.

**1. FOR:**
